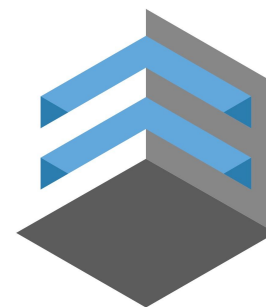

slender

synonym: lanky, skinny, slim

(1) **slender** body, (2) a long **slender** leaf

He has a **slender** income.

petulance

n. the quality of being easily irritated and childishly sulky
synonym: crankiness, irascibility, irritability

(1) babyish **petulance**, (2) an affectation of **petulance**

His impolite behavior incurred her **petulance**.

languish

v. (of a person, animal, or plant) to lose vigor, health, or flesh; to be forced to exist in an unpleasant or unwanted situation or place, often for a long time

synonym: flag, wane, wither

(1) **languish** for lack of funding, (2) **languish** under illness

He continues to **languish** in prison.

maidenhood

n. the childhood of a girl; the fact or condition of being a virgin or unmarried woman

synonym: virginity, chastity, purity

(1) old-fashioned **maidenhood**, (2) prince's **maidenhood**

She had allowed him to seduce her and gave up her **maidenhood**.

defiance

n. behavior characterized by an open refusal to obey someone or something

synonym: disobedience, disregard, confrontation

He acted in **defiance** of our decision.

dazzle

reckless

exult

bosom

n. a woman's breasts or chest

synonym: breast, bust, chest

He carried a knife in his **bosom**.

benevolence
