# pedestrian

#### pose

# prohibition

# operate

# psychology

# modify

synonym: adjust, alter, revise

# consequence

n. the outcome of a particular action or event, especially relative to an individual

synonym: result, impact, outcome

# pleasant

*adj.* enjoyable, attractive, friendly, or agreeable *synonym*: agreeable, delightful, pleasing

(1) pleasant news, (2) pleasant odor

The hotel's staff is very **pleasant** and efficient.

# unpleasant

adj. not enjoyable or comfortable

synonym: disagreeable, displeasing, distasteful

(1) **unpleasant** behavior, (2) with **unpleasant** body odor It is **unpleasant** to see criminal behavior even though it is minor.

# discourage

v. to make someone lose confidence, enthusiasm, or less willing to do something

synonym: dishearten, depress, demoralize

(1) **discourage** customers, (2) **discourage** bacterial growth His parents tried to **discourage** him from becoming an artist.

# repetition

- n. the act of doing or saying something many timessynonym: duplication, iteration, recurrence

# experiment

experimentation, investigation

# frequent

# interrupt

# suppose

#### misbehave

v. to behave badly

synonym: act up, fool around, trespass

(1) **misbehave** with language, (2) the student who had **misbehaved**

#### reward

*n.* a thing given in acknowledgment of service, hard work, achievement, etc.

synonym: compensation, gratuity, bonus

### stick

v. to put something, usually a sharp object, into something; to restrict yourself to doing or using one certain thing and not change; (noun) a thin piece of wood or other material

pierce, adhere, stay

### reaction

a response that reveals a person's feelings or attitude;
 (in chemistry) a process in which one or more substances are changed into others

synonym: response, reply, answer

groundwater.

# reliability

 the quality of being able to be trusted or believed in doing what someone desires or requires

synonym: dependability, trustability, solidness

#### assume

v. to think or accept something to be true without having proof of it; to take or begin to have power; to begin to exhibit a specific quality or appearance

synonym: guess, presume, suppose

# identically

adv. in the same way

*synonym*: likewise

(1) identically dressed, (2) identically distributed

They wore **identically** colored clothes.

### analyst

 someone whose job is to examine something to learn or understand more about it

# reviewer, investigator, judge

(1) banking **analyst**, (2) senior research **analyst**The **analyst** concluded that bankruptcy was inevitable.

#### reliable

adj. worthy of being relied on; trustworthy synonym: dependable, trustworthy, dedicated

# syllable

- a single unit of spoken language more significant than a phoneme containing a vowel sound and usually one or more consonants
- syllable structure, (2) single syllable

#### manufacture

v. to make goods in large numbers, usually in a factory using machines

*synonym*: create, fabricate, assemble

#### memoir

- a historical account or biography written from the writer's knowledge of famous people, places, or events
- (1) family **memoir**, (2) publish a **memoir**

synonym: bio, biography

He wrote his **memoirs** while awaiting trial.

#### recount

- v. to describe what happened or to narrate a story synonym: narrate, tell, report

#### adventure

 a journey or a series of events that is unusual, exciting, or dangerous

synonym: experience, happening, incident

# controversial

adj. causing a lot of hot public discussion and dispute synonym: contentious, disputed, questionable

# historic

*adj.* famous or significant in history, or potentially so *synonym*: memorable, momentous, historical

#### critic

someone who expresses opinions about the quality of books, music, etc.

synonym: pundit, analyst, attacker

(1) art critic, (2) severe critic

Advocates for legal reform hear less harsh words from their critics.

# doubt

a feeling of being uncertain about something, especially about how good or accurate it is

synonym: distrust, suspect, mistrust

(1) dispel **doubts**, (2) no **doubt** about the news **Doubt** is the start, not the end, of intelligence.

# accuracy

the state or degree of being exact or correct; the ability to perform something with proficiency and without mistake

synonym: precision, exactness, truthfulness

#### distort

to change something's shape, appearance, or sound so that it appears weird or unclear
