sober

adj. not drunk or affected by alcohol; dignified in manner or character and committed to keeping promises

synonym: calm, lucid, temperate

(1) **sober** discussion, (2) as **sober** as a judge

He led a **sober** life.

unproven

adj. not tested or proved

(1) unproven efficacy, (2) scientifically unproven

The new treatment's long-term advantages are still **unproven**.

mustache

n. an unshaved growth of hair on the upper lip

synonym: whisker

(1) a gray mustache, (2) big mustache

The actor's **mustache** has become an icon.

digress

v. to move away from the main subject temporarily, especially in speech or writing

synonym: deviate, meander, stray

(1) **digress** into my personal opinions, (2) **digress** from the main subject

The professor always digresses when he gives a lecture.

firsthand

adv. from the source; directly; (adjective) received directly from a source

synonym: direct

(1) hear customer's voices **firsthand**, (2) conduct **firsthand** research

The manager tried to hear customers' voices firsthand.

hyperinflation

- a condition where the price of everything in a national economy rises very quickly, causing damage to an economy
- (1) the risk of **hyperinflation**, (2) fear of **hyperinflation** The central bank has accelerated rate hikes to thwart **hyperinflation**.

redefine

 to change the meaning or interpretation of something; to make people think about something in a new or different way synonym: reconsider, reformulate, alter

(1) **redefine** customer experience, (2) **redefine** our role The video telephony application has **redefined** the way we work.

divergent

- adj. different or becoming different from another or a standard; tending to move apart in different directionssynonym: differing, disparate, atypical
- (1) follow a **divergent** path, (2) wildly **divergent** results

 The prime minister had to reconcile **divergent** opinions on controversial issues like abortion.

paralysis

 a condition in which you are unable to move or lose control of part or most of the body because of illness or injury

synonym: immobility, stiffness, palsy

(1) moral **paralysis**, (2) **paralysis** in the leg Massive demonstrations lead to total **paralysis** of transportation.

skeptical

- adj. doubting that something is accurate or useful synonym: doubtful, distrustful, suspicious
- a skeptical attitude, (2) skeptical scientists
 His religious and philosophical beliefs were utterly skeptical.

incentivize

v. to make someone want to do in a particular way by offering them a reward

synonym: encourage, motivate

(1) **incentivize** carpooling, (2) **incentivize** the right behavior Governments **incentivize** their citizens to buy eco-friendly products through subsidies.

paramount

adj. more important than anything else; having superior power and influence or the highest position

synonym: central, major, crucial

(1) the lord **paramount**, (2) **paramount** to all the others

This country became a country of **paramount** geostrategic importance to us.

outperform

v. to be or do something compared to others of a similar type

synonym: beat, exceed, surpass
