- n. a violation of a law or rule, especially a minor onesynonym: violation, breach, offense
- (1) a doping **infraction**, (2) **infraction** of a rule The driver was issued a citation for a minor **infraction** of the traffic laws.

tavern

- n. a public place where alcoholic drinks are servedsynonym: bar, pub, saloon
- (1) drink in a **tavern**, (2) traditional **taverns**The **tavern** keeper was a friendly man who always had a good joke.

superstition

- a belief or practice that is not based on science or reason and that is often connected with a religion
 synonym: belief, folklore, myth
- (1) **superstition** in religion, (2) believe in **superstition**There is a surviving **superstition** that black cats are a symbol of bad luck.

accuse

to charge or criticize someone with a crime or wrongdoing

synonym: charge, blame, criticize

(1) **accuse** his rudeness, (2) **accuse** each other The witness **accused** the defendant of committing the robbery.

drown

 to die or cause to die by being unable to breathe underwater

synonym: douse, drench, overwhelm

(1) **drown** in a bath, (2) I was **drowned** in work Floods have the potential to **drown** any subsurface animals easily.

unhurt

adj. not injured or harmedsynonym: uninjured, unscathed, unharmed

(1) escape unhurt, (2) unhurt passenger

The hikers were **unhurt**, despite being lost in the woods for three days.

scribe

 a person who writes out copies of documents or manuscripts, especially in ancient times

synonym: copyist, transcriber, writer

(1) **scribe** in ancient Egypt, (2) financial **scribe**The **scribe's** skills were in high demand in medieval times, when many people were illiterate.

inscription

 a message or design that is written or engraved on a surface of something, such as stone or metal

synonym: engraving, writing, script

(1) **inscription** on a plaque, (2) funerary **inscriptions**The ancient coin had an **inscription** in Latin and a picture of the emperor on the other side.

uphold

v. to support or defend something, such as a law, idea, decision, etc.

synonym: defend, maintain, sustain

(1) **uphold** the law, (2) **uphold** tradition

The judge may **uphold** the decision of the lower court.

hallmark

 a distinctive characteristic or attribute of a person or thing

synonym: symbol, authentication, indication

(1) the **hallmark** of a good scientist, (2) the **hallmark** of modern life

unearth

v. to discover or bring to light something that is in the ground or was previously hidden or unknown

synonym: discover, uncover, expose
