#### orchard

*n.* a piece of land that is planted with fruit trees, such as apples, pears, or cherries

synonym: grove, plantation, fruit garden

(1) local apple **orchard**, (2) **orchard** tree

The farmer owns an **orchard** where he grows apples, pears, and plums.

#### cassava

 a starchy, tuberous root plant that is native to South America and is grown in many tropical and subtropical regions around the world

synonym: manioc, yuca

(1) cassava flour, (2) cassava starch

**Cassava** leaves are also eaten as a vegetable in some parts of the world.

#### sugarcane

- a tall, tropical grass that is grown for its sweet,
  juice-filled stalks, which are used to make sugar and other products

#### husk

#### seize

v. to catch or take hold of someone or something suddenly and forcibly; to capture the attention or imagination of something

synonym: grab, grasp, capture

# captivity

 the situation in which a person or animal is kept in prison or a space that they cannot escape from

synonym: confinement, detention, imprisonment

(1) escape from **captivity**, (2) animals in **captivity** in the zoo

Pandas rarely breed in captivity.

#### invade

v. to enter aggressively into another's territory by military force for conquest and occupation

synonym: intrude, raid, overrun

(1) **invade** other tissues, (2) **invade** his privacy

I have no intention to **invade** your privacy.

#### imp

a mischievous or misbehaving child; a small and mischievous demon or sprite in folklore

synonym: demon, sprite, mischievous child

(1) a little imp, (2) behave like an imp

The mischievous **imp** caused trouble wherever it went.

#### uprising

a public rebellion, especially against an established government or authority

synonym: revolt, rebellion, insurgency

(1) stage an uprising, (2) violent uprising The anti-government uprising was successful in overthrowing the regime.

#### escalate

to increase in intensity, size, or severity; to make something greater, worse, or more serious

synonym: increase, intensify, expand

(1) **escalate** into a major international incident, (2) to escalate

# camouflage

an outward appearance that conceals the underlying n. essence of something; the way of concealing troops or military equipment so they cannot be seen against the surrounding environment

synonym: guise, mask, cloak
