adj. too many to be countedsynonym: many, infinite, countless

- the sea encircled by southern Europe, northern Africa, and western Asia

ransom

 a large amount of money that is paid for being made to secure the release of a person being held captive

synonym: eject, emit, burst

synonym: gossip, whisper, talk

inscription

- a message or design that is written or engraved on a surface of something, such as stone or metal

perpetual

synonym: enduring, unchanging, incessant

gratuitous
