synonym: bacterium, microbe, pathogen

beagle

 a small dog with a smooth coat, long ears, and a strong sense of smell, used for hunting hares

synonym: hound, dog, pup

Jupiter

evaporate

disintegrate

- v. break or cause to break into small fragments synonym: shatter, crumble, break down

clockwork

 a mechanism in which a series of gears, springs and other mechanical elements are used to power a device, especially a clock

synonym: mechanism, movement, gears

The **clockwork** mechanism in the grandfather clock needed to be wound up every week.

menagerie

 a collection of wild animals, especially exotic ones, kept for display

synonym: collection, assortment, group

The circus had a **menagerie** of animals, including elephants, lions, and monkeys.

corral

 a pen or enclosure for livestock, especially cattle or horses; an area surrounded by a fence

synonym: pen, enclosure, yard

The farmer used a high **corral** to keep the cattle from wandering off.

diffuse

adj. spread out widely; not concentrated in one placesynonym: spread, scatter

(1) diffuse bleeding, (2) diffuse cloud

Direct lighting is preferable to diffuse lighting when reading.

turmoil

a state of great disturbance, confusion, or uncertainty,
 often marked by intense activity or strong emotions

synonym: chaos, confusion, disorder

(1) political turmoil, (2) the turmoil of the war

The company experienced financial **turmoil** after the CEO was arrested.

pebble

 a small, smooth, rounded rock, especially one worn by the action of water

synonym: rock, stone, cobble

boulder

 a large, smooth rock, typically one that has been worn away from a cliff or mountain by erosion

planetesimal
