aback

synonym: surprised, astounded, shocked

The sudden news of the merger took me **aback**.

egotistical

n. having an inflated view of one's abilities or importance;thinking only about yourself

synonym: self-centered, self-absorbed, arrogant

(1) egotistical person, (2) egotistical behavior

He had an **egotistical** attitude and always wanted to be the center of attention.

businessperson

a person who is engaged in business, typically as an owner or executive

synonym: entrepreneur, executive

physiotherapist

 a healthcare professional who helps people affected by injury, illness, or disability through movement and exercise, manual therapy, education, and advice

synonym: physical therapist, masseur, muscle specialist

burnout

amuse

frontline

penetrate

infancy
