stateless

- adj. having no nationality or citizenship; not being affiliated with any particular state or government
- *synonym*: without citizenship, homeless

queer

adj. strange or odd, typically in an interesting or attractive way

synonym: strange, odd, unusual

(1) queer money, (2) queer fashion

The behavior of the clown at the party was quite **queer**.

embody

 to represent or exemplify something; to give tangible form to an abstract idea

synonym: represent, exemplify, personify

(1) **embody** my goal, (2) **embody** a spirit of charity The company's new products **embody** the values of innovation and sustainability.

gulf

 a large ocean inlet or deep bay that is partially enclosed by land

synonym: chasm, divide, abyss

(1) gulf war, (2) gulf stream

The **Gulf** of Mexico is a body of water in the southern United States.

raft

 a flat structure, usually made of logs or planks, that can be used for transport or as a platform for swimmer

synonym: flatboat, boat, barge

(1) a raft for carrying horses, (2) a life raft

The rubber raft was swept out to sea.

neutrino

- a very small and electrically neutral particle with a very small mass that rarely reacts with other matter
- (1) neutrino capture, (2) sterile neutrinos

This laboratory has a pool consisting of thousands of **neutrino** detectors.

pretension

meltdown

 n. the act of claiming or asserting something, especially without good reason or without evidence; an unfounded or excessive claim or ambition

synonym: presumption, pretense, affectation

synonym: collapse, disaster, failure

waterfall

 a point in a river or stream where water falls from a high place, for example, over a cliff or rock

synonym: cascade, falls, rapids

- (1) scenic waterfall, (2) a waterfall with a fall of ten feet Years of river erosion have formed the uniquely shaped waterfall basin.
- the most important or fundamental part of a matter or situation; the key point or central issue

synonym: heart, core, essence

(1) main **crux**, (2) the **crux** of the argument The **crux** of the matter was that the company was not financially stable.

imitation

a duplicate of anything, particularly something valuable;
 the act of replicating someone or something

synonym: fabrication, replica, fake

(1) **imitation** antique, (2) artificial **imitation**Many individuals believe that children learn languages through **imitation**.

crux

empower

- v. to give someone the power or authority to do something synonym: authorize, endow, entitle
- (1) **empower** my life, (2) **empower** the secretary to do the same

The company **empowered** employees to buy low-price items without approval to achieve efficient purchasing.

mediate

- to try to bring about an agreement or understanding between people who are in conflict
- synonym: arbitrate, reconcile, intervene
- (1) **mediate** allergic reaction, (2) **mediate** a negotiation The teacher had to **mediate** a disagreement between two students over a stolen pencil.

aspiration

 a strong desire to achieve something; the action or process of drawing breath

synonym: ambition, inhalation, intake

(1) no **aspiration** for fame, (2) **aspiration** into the lungs He has an **aspiration** to become a doctor.
