intention

mess

- a state of confusion, dirtiness, or untidiness; (verb) to fail to do something or to make something dirty or untidy
 synonym: disarray, confusion, predicament

eureka

exclamation of triumph on discovering something;
 realization or sudden insight

synonym: discovery, breakthrough, aha moment

cult

 a small religious group, especially one that is not part of a larger religion and that is regarded as outside the norm; followers of an exclusive system of beliefs and practices

The **cult** leader promised his followers that they would achieve enlightenment if they followed his teachings.

hell

the place thought to be where bad people go and are punished after death, often depicted as being located beneath the earth; an extraordinarily unpleasant or difficult place

The battlefield became **hell** on earth.

polluted

adj. contaminated with harmful or poisonous substances synonym: contaminated, poisoned, unclean

remedy

 a successful way of dealing with or improving an unpleasant or difficult situation or curing an illness

soil

- n. the top layer of Earth in which plants grow synonym: earth, ground, mud

erosion

 the wearing away of rock, soil, or land by natural processes such as wind or water

synonym: corrosion, weathering, decay

ceremony

- n. a formal event or ritual, often religious or solemnsynonym: ritual, rite, observance

grasshopper

 large jumping insect; used to symbolize restlessness or ephemerality

bug

 any tiny insect; a fault or defect in a computer program, system, or machine

garlic

a strong-smelling pungent-tasting bulb used as a seasoning in cooking

myth

- an ancient story or set of stories accepted as history, especially explaining the worldview of a people
 synonym: fable, legend, lore
- (1) the **myth** of an old religion, (2) perpetuate a **myth** With the financial bubble bursting, the **myth** of economic growth in investment banking collapsed.

disappear

- v. to cease to exist or be visiblesynonym: fade, evaporate, vanish


