Newtonian

adj. relating to Sir Isaac Newton or his laws of motion and universal gravitation

synonym: classical, physics, mechanics

(1) **Newtonian** physics, (2) **Newtonian** mechanics

The motion of planets can be described using **Newtonian** mechanics.

Catholic

- adj. universal and including many different types of things; related to or associated with the part of the Christian Church that has the Pope as its leader
- (1) **catholic** in his tastes, (2) the **Catholic** Church Sociologists are now interested in **catholic** world peace.

rebellion

 an act of violent or open resistance to an established government or ruler

synonym: insurrection, uprising, revolt

astronomer

- synonym: stargazer, cosmologist, astrophysicist

synonym: excuse, overlook, tolerate

revolve

v. to rotate around a central point

synonym: rotate, spin, orbit

(1) **revolve** at high speed, (2) **revolve** around a central axis. The Earth **revolves** around the Sun in an elliptical orbit.

treatise

 a written work that deals with a particular subject in a thorough and systematic way

synonym: essay, dissertation, thesis

(1) collective **treatise**, (2) the subject of a **treatise**He wrote a **treatise** on the history of philosophy, covering the ideas and theories of major philosophers.

inquisition

 a judicial or official inquiry, especially one aimed at suppressing dissent or heresy

synonym: investigation, examination, probe

(1) propose an **inquisition**, (2) submit him to an **inquisition**The **inquisition** was a period of religious persecution in
Europe.

defy

ν. to challenge or dare someone to do something; to resist or disobey a rule, decision, etc.

synonym: challenge, resist, disobey

(1) defy gravity, (2) defy authority

She tried to **defy** her parents by moving to the city against their wishes.

commute

v. to regularly travel a particular journey, especially between one's home and place of work; (noun) a regular journey of some distance to and from your place of work

synonym: travel, journey, trip

(1) commute to work, (2) daily commute

He had to **commute** two hours each way to get to work.

papal
