skepticism

 an attitude of doubting or questioning that claims or statements are true or valuable or that something will happen; the disbelief in any claims of ultimate knowledge

synonym: distrust, doubt, suspicion

matrix

The **matrix** of numbers on the spreadsheet allowed the accountant to track the company's profits and losses easily.

simulate

v. to make a pretense of someone's behavior or looks; to reproduce something that exists in real life using computers, models, etc., usually for study or training

purposes

synonym: pretend, imitate, mimic

(1) **simulate** climate change, (2) **simulate** a future scenario He had painted the wood to **simulate** stone.

brain

 the organ inside the head that is responsible for one's movement, thought, memory, and feeling

synonym: intellect, mind, encephalon

(1) basic **brain** function, (2) permanent **brain** damage X-rays revealed a small tumor in his **brain**.

dilemma

 a situation in which a difficult choice has to be made between two or more options, especially that are equally unfavorable ones

synonym: difficulty, plight, predicament

(1) chicken-and-egg **dilemma**, (2) be in a **dilemma**The choice between bureaucracy and adhocracy represents a common **dilemma**.

external

adj. belonging to or situated outside of someone or something

synonym: outside, exterior, foreign

(1) **external** factors, (2) **external** commerce
When a company discloses information to the market, an **external** auditor verifies them.

philosophy

- n. the study of general and fundamental questions, such as those about existence, reason, knowledge, values, mind synonym: doctrine, attitude, creed
- (1) **philosophy** of education, (2) western **philosophy** Ethics is a branch of **philosophy**.

argument

 a set of statements or reasons used to support or refute a proposition or theory; a verbal or physical fight or dispute

synonym: debate, discourse, discussion

(1) a blazing **argument**, (2) the **argument** against capital punishment

The **argument** between the two sides over the proposed policy was heated.

intention

- n. something you want to do and are going to dosynonym: purpose, connotation, will
- (1) **intention** behind his decision, (2) clear **intention** Our CEO's **intentions** are always transparent and straightforward.

undermine

v. to make someone or something less powerful, less effective, weaker gradually; to make someone's fame, confidence, or authority less effective or weaker gradually

synonym: damage, subvert, weaken

(1) **undermine** a good relationship, (2) **undermine** their adversary's reputation

They tried to undermine her position by slandering her.

allege

v. to claim or assert that something is true without providing proof or evidence

synonym: claim, assert, state

(1) allege abuse, (2) allege wrongdoing

The prosecution **alleged** that the defendant was guilty of the crime.

skeptic

 a person who doubts or questions the truth of specific claims, beliefs, or doctrines, especially those in religion or the supernatural

synonym: doubter, disbeliever, questioner

(1) an ingrained skeptic, (2) climate skeptic

He was a **skeptic** who doubted the existence of supernatural phenomena.

skeptical

adj. doubting that something is accurate or useful synonym: doubtful, distrustful, suspicious

(1) a skeptical attitude,	(2) skeptical scientists
His religious and philoso	phical beliefs were utterly skeptical .

ordinary

- adj. not different, exceptional, or unexpected in any way, especially in quality, ability, size, or degreesynonym: mundane, prosaic, average
- (1) an **ordinary** school, (2) **ordinary** annual revenue The **ordinary** session of the Diet opened.

reinterpretation

- a new or different interpretation or explanation of something, especially a text or piece of artwork
 synonym: re-evaluation, re-assessment, re-examination
- (1) **reinterpretation** of history, (2) **reinterpretation** of the Constitution

The artist's **reinterpretation** of the classic painting received mixed reviews.

elaborate

- adj. containing a lot of carefully prepared and organized or many complicated and detailed partssynonym: detailed, intricate, complicated
- (1) an **elaborate** hat, (2) **elaborate** Ponzi scheme He proposed an **elaborate** program of public works.

resolve

- v. to find a suitable answer to the problems or difficulty synonym: decide, determine, fix

defeat

synonym: contemplation, reflection, introspection

possibility

- n. a chance that something may happen or be truesynonym: chance, prospect, likelihood
- (1) **possibility** for growth, (2) **possibility** of a major earthquake

The **possibility** of getting the disease will drastically increase.

malevolent

adj. having or showing a desire to cause harm or evil to others

synonym: evil, malicious, wicked

malevolent stars, (2) malevolent act
 She had a malevolent intention to harm her enemy.

deceive

- v. to cause someone to believe something that is not true, often by telling a lie or creating a false impression synonym: mislead, dupe, hoodwink
- (1) deceive to lie, (2) deceive skillfully

The magician's illusions were designed to **deceive** the audience into believing they saw something impossible.

regard

v. to think about or consider somebody or something in a specified way

synonym: consider, see, reckon

(1) **regard** him as an enemy, (2) **regard** the situation as unfortunate

Frugality and industry are still regarded as virtues.

scandal

 an action or event regarded as morally or legally wrong and causing general public outrage

synonym: controversy, outrage, uproar

(1) **scandal** magazine, (2) a corruption **scandal** The political **scandal** rocked the nation and led to the resignation of several high-ranking officials.
