- synonym: fortress, bastion, citadel

fortress

 a large and strongly built structure, typically with high walls and a moat, used as a military defense or for protection against attackers

synonym: castle, citadel, stronghold

monarch

- n. a person who rules a country, such as a king or queen synonym: ruler, sovereign, majesty

moor

- n. a large area of open country, typically on high ground, covered with rough grass or heath, especially in Britain synonym: heath, upland, bog

someone something that causes feelings of wonder or surprise

synonym: wonder, phenomenon, amazement

fascinate

 to attract and hold the attention of someone deeply and irresistibly

synonym: captivate, intrigue, mesmerize

terrify

- v. to frighten someone very much synonym: unnerve, scare, horrify

troop
