 a member of the clergy or a person connected with the Christian Church

synonym: clergy, priest, minister

heresy

- n. an opinion or belief that goes against the traditional or generally accepted view, especially in religionsynonym: dissent, apostasy, unorthodoxy

grisly

synonym: equivalent, interchangeable, similar
