gadget

graveyard

sensational

synonym: amazing, incredible, phenomenal

The performance was **sensational**, with standing ovations throughout.

relegate

v. to assign or dismiss to a lower or less important status or place; to demote

synonym: demote, assign, transfer

unbreakable

adj. not able to be broken or damaged synonym: indestructible, durable, sturdy

gamble

v. to take risky action in the hope of being successful; to play or game for money or other stakes

synonym: bet, venture, wager

adrenaline

 a substance secreted by the adrenal medulla in response to stress, which makes the heart beat faster and prepares the body to react to danger

synonym: epinephrine

The band has released a lot of **adrenaline-pumping** rock music.

statistician

- n. a person who studies or is an expert in statisticssynonym: actuary
