### permafrost

- a layer of soil that is permanently below freezing, usually in polar regions
- (1) permafrost area, (2) thawing permafrostPermafrost is crucial to soil stability in arctic areas.

#### thaw

# microorganism

 a very small living thing that may exist in its single-celled form or as a colony of cells and is too small to be seen without a microscope

synonym: germ, microbe, bacterium

This **microorganism** is a producer of respiratory disease.

# decompose

v. to break down or cause to break down over time into simpler substances or elements

synonym: break down, rot, spoil

(1) **decompose** matter, (2) **decompose** into simpler molecules

After the earthquake, many of the buildings in the city were left in ruins and began to **decompose**.

### subfreezing

adj. below the freezing point (32 F or 0 C)

synonym: below-freezing, icy, frigid

(1) live in a **subfreezing** climate, (2) **subfreezing** temperature

The temperature outside was **subfreezing**, and I could feel the chill in my bones.

#### fossilized

 adj. transformed into a fossil (= something preserved in rock for a very long period) or preserved in the form of a fossil; antiquated or inflexible

synonym: petrified, ossified, preserved

### extrapolate

#### pup

n. a young dog, seal, or other animals

synonym: puppy, whelp, cub

The little **pup** was so cute, with big, floppy ears and a wagging tail.

#### nestle

v. to settle comfortably or cozily into a place

synonym: snuggle, cuddle, curl up

(1) **nestle** deeper against him, (2) **nestle** in a cozy spot The cat **nestled** in my lap and fell asleep.

#### reindeer

 a large deer with branched antlers found in northern regions, often domesticated and used for transportation or as a source of food

synonym: caribou, elk, deer

(1) red-nosed **reindeer**, (2) domesticated **reindeer**The Sami people have been herding **reindeer** in the Arctic for centuries, using them for food, transportation, and clothing.

#### herder

 a person who takes care of and manages a herd of livestock, such as cows, sheep, or goats

synonym: shepherd, rancher, drover

The sheep **herder** led his flock through the hills, keeping a watchful eye on them at all times.

#### unmistakable

#### extinct

adj. no longer in existence

#### skeletal

adj. of, relating to, or forming a skeleton (= frame of bones); very thin or emaciated

synonym: bony, emaciated, gaunt

The older man was skinny and skeletal and not in good

#### health.

#### reconstruct

synonym: rebuild, revamp, reorganize

#### regenerate
