bass

# grateful

# discourage

#### cluster

# charity

#### nonprofit

- adj. not established for commercial profitsynonym: charitable

# talent

# mentorship

synonym: guidance, coaching, tutorship

# conservatory

 a place where plants are grown and cultivated, often for scientific or educational purposes; a school or institution that provides training in music, dance, or other performing arts

# inspire

# geography

# boundary

# digital

# biology


