pulmonate

weird

adj. extraordinary, unexpected, or difficult to explain *synonym*: bizarre, creepy, peculiar

fascinating

adj. extremely interesting synonym: alluring, intriguing, captivating

(1) **fascinating** story, (2) completely **fascinating** to me The museum houses a **fascinating** collection of Celtic artifacts.

nudibranch

 a marine gastropod mollusk without a shell and with conspicuous or brightly colored gills found typically in

warm seas

synonym: nudi, sea slug, naked slug

(1) nudibranch species, (2) colorful nudibranch

The diet of **nudibranchs** often consists of small invertebrates such as sea anemones, hydroids, and sponges.

branch

 a division of a tree or woody shrub that grows out from the trunk or a main stem; a division of some larger or more complex organization

synonym: limb, twig, bough

(1) branch office, (2) a branch pipe

The **branch** of the tree had fallen and blocked the road.

gill

 a respiratory organ of fish and some other aquatic animals that extracts dissolved oxygen from water and excretes carbon dioxide

feathery
