### persecute

#### orientation

### gender

the range of characteristics of femininity and masculinity and differentiating between them, especially when considering social and cultural differences rather than differences in biology

### identity

n. the fact of being who or what somebody or something is; the features, emotions, or ideas that distinguish persons from one another

### penal

### arbitrary

#### arrest
