#### holla

v. to shout or call out loudly, particularly as a greeting or to get someone's attention, often used as an exclamation to express excitement, joy, or agreement

synonym: shout, yell, call out

(1) holla back, (2) holla at you on the app

# repulsion

 a feeling of intense disgust or dislike; a physical force that resists the approach or contact of two objects

synonym: dislike, disgust, repugnance

(1) **repulsion** force, (2) sense of **repulsion**

# opportune

adj. suitable or happening at a time that is suitable or convenient for a particular purpose

synonym: suitable, timely, practical

(1) **opportune** occasion, (2) an **opportune** remark

The phone rang at the most **opportune** time.

#### subsidize

v. to pay part of the cost of something to support an organization, activity, etc. financially

synonym: finance, endow, sponsor

(1) **subsidize** the project, (2) **subsidize** the cost Governments **subsidize** renewable energy generation in various ways.

# predominate

v. to be the most powerful, important, or frequent; to be more common or prevalent than others

synonym: reign, prevail, rule

(1) **predominate** in the army, (2) **predominate** religion In this particular field, his work **predominated** over all others.

### pawnshop

 a business where loans are made in exchange for personal property that serves as collateral; typically, the property is resold if the loan is not repaid

synonym: pawnbroker, pledge store, second-hand shop

(1) **pawnshop** theft, (2) **pawnshop** owner I sold my old jewelry at the **pawnshop** to make some extra cash.

# underprivileged

adj. lacking resources, opportunities, or advantages that are necessary for success

synonym: poor, disadvantaged, destitute

(1) poor and **underprivileged** elderly, (2) **underprivileged** communities

The **underprivileged** children were in dire need of food, clothing, and shelter.

# grind

v. to reduce something to small particles or powder by crushing or rubbing it; to work hard over a long period of time

synonym: mill, crush, grate

(1) **grind** away at my work, (2) **grind** your teeth She had to **grind** the coffee beans before making a fresh cup.

#### libertarian

n. a person who believes that people should be free to think and behave as they want and the government should only have a minimal level of control, and a person who advocates those beliefs

synonym: latitudinarian

(1) **libertarian** group, (2) civil **libertarian** 

Western liberal democracy serves as the foundation for the **libertarian** philosophy of the media.

#### enslave

 to make someone a slave; to deprive someone of their freedom of choice or action

synonym: coerce, deprive, imprison

(1) **enslave** poor peasants, (2) **enslave** indigenous people Her beauty **enslaved** me completely.

#### savage

adj. extremely wild, ferocious, or uncivilized

synonym: brutal, fierce, barbarous

(1) reply in a **savage** voice, (2) **savage** attack

The animal was injured and became **savage**, attacking anyone who approached.

#### unaddressed

adj. not dealt with, resolved, or attended to; lacking attention or consideration

synonym: unanswered, ignored, neglected

(1) unaddressed risks, (2) unaddressed letter

The community is frustrated with the **unaddressed** issue of crime in the area.

### predatory

adj. living by eating other animals, especially by catching prey that is still alive

synonym: raptorial, hunting, greedy

(1) a predatory bird, (2) predatory warfare

The domesticated cat still has its **predatory** instincts.

#### industrious

adj. hardworking, diligent, and persistent in effort

synonym: diligent, hardworking, assiduous

(1) industrious worker, (2) industrious student

He was known to be very **industrious** and would often work late into the night.

#### reinvent

v. to change something so drastically that it looks to be completely new

synonym: recreate, remake, revive

(1) **reinvent** local dishes, (2) **reinvent** our life They have tried to **reinvent** their grocery stores.

#### wherein

adv. in or during which; in the place, time, or situation that

(1) progress to a level **wherein**, (2) **wherein** he is mistaken. The court ruled in favor of the plaintiff, **wherein** they were awarded damages for the defendant's negligence.

# gentrify

v. to renovate, revitalize, or develop a deteriorated, predominantly urban area, often leading to the displacement of low-income or minority residents and the influx of more affluent residents and businesses

synonym: revitalize, renovate, renew

(1) **gentrify** a community, (2) **gentrify** a street

The new coffee shops and high-end boutiques are starting to **gentrify** the neighborhood.

nudge

v. to push someone or something gently, especially with your elbow, to attract the person's attention; (noun) a small push or prod to encourage a desired action or behavior

synonym: bump, elbow, (noun) prod

(1) **nudge** price levels up, (2) give a person a **nudge** The teacher **nudged** the student to get his attention and asked him a question.

accuse

to charge or criticize someone with a crime or wrongdoing

synonym: charge, blame, criticize

(1) **accuse** his rudeness, (2) **accuse** each other The witness **accused** the defendant of committing the robbery.

# liquidate

v. to settle accounts and pay off debts, often by selling off assets; to eliminate or get rid of something completely
 synonym: sell off, close down, dispose of

(1) liquidate debt, (2) liquidate a company

The company had to **liquidate** its assets due to bankruptcy.

#### entice

v. to attract or lure someone with something desirable or tempting

synonym: lure, tempt, attract

(1) **entice** foreign investment, (2) **entice** shoppers

The salesperson tried to **entice** the customer into buying a new car.

# privatize

v. to transfer ownership or control of a business or industry from government or public control to private ownership or control; to make something into a private enterprise or organization

synonym: deregulate, denationalize

(1) **privatize** post offices, (2) **privatize** healthcare The government wants to **privatize** specific industries to boost their efficiency.

#### landless

- adj. lacking ownership or possession of land or property;without a fixed or permanent home or residencesynonym: land-free, homeless
- (1) **landless** peasants, (2) **landless** laborer Many **landless** farmers struggle to make ends meet.

#### exacerbate

- v. to make a situation, problem, or feeling worse synonym: worsen, aggravate, escalate
- (1) **exacerbate** the situation, (2) **exacerbate** symptoms The heat wave **exacerbated** the drought conditions.

#### incarceration

- n. the state of being confined in prison or jail synonym: confinement, imprisonment, detention
- (1) mass incarceration, (2) incarceration rates

The judge sentenced him to five years of **incarceration** for embezzlement.

#### aspiring

adj. desiring or striving for recognition or advancement; wanting to be successful in life

synonym: hopeful, ambitious, eager

aspiring prime minister, (2) have aspiring eyes
 He was extremely generous to the aspiring young artist.

### speculator

 a person who invests in a venture with the hope of making a profit, often taking on significant risks; someone who engages in speculation

synonym: investor, trader, gambler

(1) risky **speculator**, (2) stock market **speculator**The land **speculator** purchased large tracts of land in anticipation of future development.

ken

n. knowledge, perception, understanding, or range of sight;(verb) to be aware of or know

synonym: knowledge, understanding, familiarity

(1) within my **ken**, (2) **ken** of the person

He had a good **ken** of the city and could easily find his way around.

#### rehabilitate

v. to restore to good health or physical condition; to help someone return to a normal life, especially after a period of illness, addiction, or imprisonment

synonym: reform, restore, renovate

(1) **rehabilitate** prisoners, (2) **rehabilitate** wildlife
The organization works to **rehabilitate** drug addicts and help them rebuild their lives.

blight

v. to have a detrimental effect on something, typically causing it to deteriorate or fail; (noun) any plant disease resulting in withering without rotting

synonym: devastate, ruin, decimate

(1) blight his life, (2) blight a crop

The abandoned factory was **blighted** by vandalism and graffiti.

#### livelihood

a means of earning money people need to pay for food,
 a place to live, clothing, etc.

synonym: occupation, living, income

# kelp

- n. a large brown seaweed that grows in cold coastal waterssynonym: seaweed, marine algae
- (1) kelp forest, (2) giant kelp

The coast was lined with beds of kelp swaying in the tide.

#### ancestral

adj. related to or connected with members of your family from the past

synonym: hereditary, inherited, patrimonial

(1) an **ancestral** graveyard, (2) **ancestral** roots

The **ancestral** home has been in the family for generations.

# bioplastic

 a type of plastic derived from natural materials, particularly biologically-based sources such as cornstarch or sugarcane, rather than petroleum-based sources, generally biodegradable and eco-friendly

synonym: biodegradable plastic, eco-plastic, plant-based plastic

(1) **bioplastic** container, (2) **bioplastic** utensils Companies are beginning to use **bioplastics** as an eco-friendly alternative to traditional plastic.

#### methane

- a chemical compound with the chemical formula CH4 with no smell or color, often used as a fuel
- (1) atmospheric **methane**, (2) reduce **methane** emissions The ignition of **methane** gas in the plant killed five employees.

#### satchel

 a bag, often made of leather, with a strap for carrying over the shoulder or across the body; typically used to carry personal belongings, such as books or a laptop synonym: bag, knapsack, backpack

## quinceanera

#### manifestation

#### sham

 something that is not as good or true as it seems to be and is intended to deceive people; a person who pretends to be something they are not

synonym: bogus, counterfeit, fraudulent
