#### revolution

#### invoke

## goddess

nation

#### enslave

#### rename

## colony

## dramatic

#### divine

#### animate

- v. to make something full of interest and energysynonym: invigorate, energize, enliven
- (1) **animate** the body, (2) **animate** his soul The positive attitude of the supervisor **animated** the discussion.

#### tribute

- a payment, gift, or other forms of recognition made in honor of or submission to another person or entity
- *synonym*: honor, accolade, recognition

The statue was built as a **tribute** to the soldiers who died in the war.

# identify

- v. to recognize someone or something and say or prove who or what they are
- synonym: determine, specify, recognize

#### fascinate

- v. to attract and hold the attention of someone deeply and irresistibly
- synonym: captivate, intrigue, mesmerize

## poet

- n. a person who writes poetrysynonym: versifier, rhymer, writer

#### moral

## profound

#### meditation

#### bible

#### dismiss

v. to regard something or someone as not important and not worth considering; to terminate someone's employment

# politician

synonym: congressperson, lawmaker, legislator

a politician in the ruling party, (2) a corrupt politician

#### modern

adj. of or belonging to the present time or recent times synonym: contemporary, stylish, current

(1) **modern** poetry, (2) pre-**modern** agricultural society Their headquarters are in a **modern** skyscraper.

## topic

## slavery

 the practice or system of owning, buying, and selling people as property and forcing them to work

synonym:

## grateful

## critique

# independence
