# platform

## individual

# conversation

#### branch

# bulletproof

# possession

- n. the state or fact of owning or having somethingsynonym: ownership, holding, control

#### criminal

# paperwork

#### creditor

# compete

 to strive to achieve more success than someone or something

#### centric

#### mindset

 the established set of attitudes or fixed ideas held by someone

#### modern

# disrupt

v. to prevent or stop something, especially an event, activity, or process, from continuing in the usual way by causing a problem or disturbance
