 the established set of attitudes or fixed ideas held by someone

synonym: attitude, ethos, mentality

Countries whose goal is economic development often focus on fostering an entrepreneurial **mindset** in each individual.

purposeful

adj. having a specific aim or purpose; determined *synonym*: determined, resolved, resolute

(1) **purposeful** series of actions, (2) at a **purposeful** pace She had a **purposeful** look and was determined to complete the task.

instill

- v. to impart, introduce, or cause to be absorbed gradually synonym: implant, ingrain, inculcate
- (1) **instill** confidence, (2) **instill** medication into my eye
 The teacher attempted to **instill** the importance of hard work
 in her students.

regiment

 a large military unit, usually consisting of several battalions and commanded by a colonel or higher-ranking officer; a strict or organized system or routine

synonym: unit, brigade, battalion

(1) logistics **regiment**, (2) marching **regiment**The army **regiment** marched in perfect unison during the parade.

detain

 to keep someone in official custody; to prevent them from leaving

synonym: hold, keep, detainment

(1) **detain** a terrorist, (2) **detain** for investigation The police **detained** the suspect for questioning.

horrific

adj. causing horror or disgust; gruesome and terrifying synonym: terrifying, alarming, shocking

(1) horrific experience, (2) horrific condition

The accident scene was **horrific**, with bodies and debris scattered everywhere.

disrespect

an expression of lack of regard or contempt for someone or something

synonym: impoliteness, rudeness, insult

(1) mean no **disrespect**, (2) **disrespect** for a customer His **disrespectful** behavior towards his elders earned him a stern warning from his parents.

regress

 to move or develop backward; to return to an earlier or less advanced state or condition; to decline or deteriorate

synonym: retrovert, deteriorate, decline

(1) regress to childhood, (2) regress in skills

The team's failure to win games has caused them to **regress** in confidence.

brink

n. the point at which something is about to happen; the edge of a steep place

synonym: edge, verge, threshold

(1) brink of war, (2) on the brink

We were on the **brink** of a financial crisis.

quitter

 a person who gives up easily or does not have the determination to finish what they have started

synonym: coward, deserter, surrender

(1) easy quitter, (2) serial quitter

He was labeled as a **quitter** after he abandoned the project halfway.

insanity

- n. the state of being seriously mentally ill; madnesssynonym: madness, psychosis, lunacy
- (1) sheer **insanity**, (2) alcoholic **insanity**

His behavior became increasingly erratic, leading many to

believe he was experiencing a bout of insanity.

misfortune

an unfortunate event or circumstance; bad luck or trouble

synonym: adversity, calamity, tragedy

clap

transmute

- v. to change or convert from one form or substance to another, often in a transformative or profound way

noteworthy

adj. deserving of attention, interest, or acclaim; significant or remarkable

synonym: remarkable, significant, notable

(1) **noteworthy** achievement, (2) **noteworthy** event The artist's latest work received **noteworthy** critical acclaim.

mast

- n. a long pole aboard a boat or ship that holds up the sails

The main cabin is located in front of the **mast**.

confession

 a formal statement in which one admits that they have done something wrong or illegal
