coincide

disinformation

 false or misleading information that is spread deliberately, usually with the intent to deceive or manipulate public opinion

skeptical

adj. doubting that something is accurate or useful

implausible

adj. difficult to believe or accept as true; not credible or convincing; unlikely or improbable

synonym: incredulous, far-fetched, unbelievable

The detective found the suspect's story **implausible** and decided to investigate further.

#### contentious

adj. likely to cause people to disagree and argue; liking to argue

synonym: antagonistic, combative, confrontational

(1) contentious subject, (2) contentious debate

There are many **contentious** issues in claiming a patent.

#### erupt

v. (of a volcano) to become active and eject rocks, smoke, etc.; to start abruptly and violently

synonym: eject, emit, burst

(1) erupt in anger, (2) erupt into tears

Battles between whites and blacks erupted immediately.

#### reverence

- n. a deep respect for someone or somethingsynonym: respect, honor, awe
- (1) **reverence** for tradition, (2) pay **reverence** to him The people of the village showed great **reverence** for the elderly.

#### distract

v. to draw someone's attention away from what they are trying to do

synonym: divert, preoccupy, confuse

(1) **distract** attention from the real issue, (2) **distract** public opinion

Please don't distract me while I'm studying.

#### chronicle

a historical account of events arranged in order of time,
 typically without analysis or interpretation

synonym: record, history, annals

(1) **chronicle** of the war, (2) heroic **chronicle** 

The **chronicle** of the kingdom's history was passed down through generations of royalty.

#### divisive

adj. tending to cause disagreement or hostility between people

synonym: polarizing, contentious, disagreeable

(1) **divisive** question, (2) suppress **divisive** arguments
The proposed policy has been met with **divisive** reactions
from the public.

#### human-made

adj. created or produced by humans; artificialsynonym: artificial, unnatural, manufactured

(1) **human-made** climate change, (2) the worst **human-made** disaster

The bridge is a **human-made** structure and was built to span the river.

#### industrious

adj. hardworking, diligent, and persistent in effortsynonym: diligent, hardworking, assiduous

(1) **industrious** worker, (2) **industrious** student He was known to be very **industrious** and would often work late into the night.

### pandemic

 an outbreak of a disease that affects many people over a very wide area

synonym: outbreak

(1) flu pandemic, (2) global pandemic

They fear a **pandemic** of a new type of virus.

#### toolbox

 a container or storage unit for tools, typically characterized by a handle and one or more compartments for organizing and storing various tools and equipment

synonym: tool chest, tool kit, tool bag

(1) design toolbox, (2) toolbox storage

You should always keep a basic **toolbox** in your car in case of an emergency.

# disparate

adj. very different or distinct from something else and is not connected or comparable in any way

synonym: different, distinct, separate

(1) **disparate** impact, (2) physically **disparate** location The organization worked to bring together **disparate** groups in the community.

### fussy

adj. excessively concerned with minor details and trivialities;
 easily irritated or bothered by small annoyances;
 requiring or showing excessive attention or care

*synonym*: picky, finicky, particular

(1) fussy eater, (2) fussy cat

The baby's **fussy** behavior indicated that she was not feeling well.

## grapple

v. to make a strenuous effort to solve a problem; to engage in a close fight or conflict without weapons

synonym: brawl, scuffle, wrestle

(1) **grapple** with problem, (2) **grapple** with each other He needed to **grapple** with structural reforms to improve the company's revenue.

#### intellect

 the ability to think logically and comprehend information, especially at an advanced level

*synonym*: mind, brightness, cleverness

(1) enrich my intellect, (2) human intellect

Your **intellect** is capable of distinguishing among similar objects.

# agreeable

adj. pleasant and enjoyable

synonym: affable, amiable, cooperative

(1) **agreeable** weather, (2) **agreeable** to the plan We spent a most **agreeable** couple of days.

### instinctively

adv. as a matter of nature or intuition rather than thought or training

synonym: inherently, intuitively, naturally

(1) **instinctively** grabbed the knife, (2) **instinctively** bad

### polarization

 the division or separation of something into two opposing or contrasting groups or factions; the condition of being polarized or having poles

synonym: polarity, division, separation

# uphold

v. to support or defend something, such as a law, idea, decision, etc.

synonym: defend, maintain, sustain

## uplift

 the process of raising land to a higher elevation, or the result of this process; (verb) fill with high spirits

synonym: upthrust, upheaval, (verb) raise

(1) **uplift** mountains, (2) **uplift** my spirit

The **uplift** in the stock market has been a relief to investors.

#### slant

 to lean or slope in a particular direction; to present or interpret information or a situation in a biased or distorted way

synonym: slope, tilt, incline

(1) slant upward, (2) slant a hat

The news article **slanted** the story in favor of one political party.

# interdependence

- n. the fact or state of depending on each other synonym: relation, interconnection, linkage
- (1) **interdependence** of mind and body, (2) global **interdependence**

The diplomatic rivalry between the two countries has strengthened the **interdependence** of their intra-regional supply chains for their manufacturing industries.

# humility

candor

 the quality or condition of being humble; a low estimate of one's self

*synonym*: humbleness, modesty, unpretentiousness

- (1) develop an attitude of **humility**, (2) lack of **humility** We were filled with **humility** at the sight of the Queen.
- the quality of being open, honest, and frank; the act of speaking truthfully and directly without evasion or pretense

synonym: frankness, honesty, openness

(1) **candor** policy, (2) speak with **candor**Her **candor** in admitting her mistake was refreshing and earned her respect.

# opportune

adj. suitable or happening at a time that is suitable or convenient for a particular purpose

synonym: suitable, timely, practical

(1) **opportune** occasion, (2) an **opportune** remark The phone rang at the most **opportune** time.
