### migrant

n. a traveler who moves from one region or country to another, especially to find work or better living conditions; a bird or an animal that moves from one place to another

*synonym*: immigrant, itinerant, transient

(1) **migrant** worker, (2) the movement of **migrant** birds

The government revoked his license to employ **migrant** labor crews.

#### lawmaker

 a politician or legislator who is responsible for making and changing laws

synonym: lawgiver, legislator, solon

(1) female lawmaker, (2) incumbent lawmaker

This company has increased political contributions to federal lawmakers.

#### unclaimed

adj. not claimed, taken, or retrieved by someone who has a right or interest to it; not owned or controlled by anyone or left abandoned

synonym: abandoned, unreclaimed, unowned

(1) unclaimed funds, (2) unclaimed luggage

After a certain period of time, **unclaimed** property is sold at auction.

#### wade

v. to walk through water that is not deep enough to swim in; to struggle or proceed slowly and laboriously through something, such as a difficult situation or a crowd of people

synonym: paddle, trudge, slosh

(1) **wade** down a street, (2) **wade** through paperwork I had to **wade** through the knee-deep water to get to the other side of the river.

#### confuse

v. to mistake one thing for another; to make somebody hard to understand

synonym: confound, obscure, disorient

(1) **confuse** the listener, (2) **confuse** fantasy with reality Her remarks **confused** the debate.

#### scatter

- v. to cause to separate and go in different directions synonym: disperse, spread, bestrew
- (1) **scatter** seeds, (2) **scatter** around the internet The hunter's approach **scattered** the geese.

### bulletproof

adj. intended to resist bullet penetration synonym: unassailable, impregnable

(1) **bulletproof** armor, (2) **bulletproof** vehicle

adj. not seen or noticed; not perceivedsynonym: invisible, hidden, undercover
