#### enchant

- v. to cast a spell on; to fascinate or charm someone synonym: charm, captivate, bewitch

  The fairy's spell **enchanted** the prince, making him fall asleep for 100 years.

#### waver

#### geas

#### itch

#### barricade

#### flirt

#### opportune

*synonym*: suitable, timely, practical

#### enlist

synonym: join, sign up, appoint

#### mystification
