 People can suffocate from a lack of oxygen in confined

spaces.

bureaucracy

 a system of government in which most of the important decisions are made by state officials rather than by elected representatives

synonym: administration, government, system

(1) government **bureaucracy**, (2) arbitrary **bureaucracy**The bumbling **bureaucracy** made it difficult to get the permits we needed.

determinant

 a factor, circumstance, or condition that contributes to the shaping, influencing, or determining of a particular outcome or result

synonym: cause, factor, element

(1) environmental **determinant**, (2) a **determinant** of crop yields

One **determinant** of success is having a positive attitude and a strong work ethic.

shepherd

a person who tends and guards sheep, especially in a rural area

synonym: herder, flock-keeper, sheepdog

(1) **shepherd** boy, (2) sheep without a **shepherd**The **shepherd's** dog helped keep the sheep in line and protect them from predators.

industrious

adj. hardworking, diligent, and persistent in effortsynonym: diligent, hardworking, assiduous

(1) **industrious** worker, (2) **industrious** student He was known to be very **industrious** and would often work late into the night.

smuggle

- v. to import or export something or someone without paying appropriate customs duties, often illegally

limbo

a state of being uncertain, unknown, or neglected; an imaginary place for lost or neglected things

synonym: purgatory, oblivion, no man's land

Her career was in **limbo** as she waited for a job offer.

illuminate

v. to light something or to make something lighter or brighter; to make something free from confusion or ambiguity

synonym: brighten, light, adorn

(1) **illuminate** a dark hall, (2) **illuminate** my understanding That biologist **illuminated** the mechanism of heredity.

opportune

adj. suitable or happening at a time that is suitable or convenient for a particular purpose

synonym: suitable, timely, practical

(1) **opportune** occasion, (2) an **opportune** remark The phone rang at the most **opportune** time.

reunification

 the act of bringing something back together; the reuniting of previously separated parts

synonym: integration, consolidation, reuniting

(1) **reunification** talks, (2) family **reunification**The **reunification** of the two countries was celebrated with great joy.

germ

 a very tiny living that causes the disease; a piece of something such as an organism, concept, etc., capable of growing into a new one or part of one

synonym: bacterium, microbe, pathogen

(1) antibiotic-resistant **germ**, (2) a **germ-free** environment The **germ** of his idea came from watching birds flying in

flocks.

traitor

a person who betrays someone or something, such as a friend, cause, or principle, to which they had previously been loyal; a person who commits treason against their country or sovereign

synonym: betrayal, turncoat, renegade

reunite

to bring two or more people together again after a period of separation

synonym: reconcile, reunify, reconvene

assassination

nerd

backlog

evacuate

The town was forced to **evacuate** due to the hurricane approaching.

empower

The company **empowered** employees to buy low-price items without approval to achieve efficient purchasing.

long-lasting

adj. existing or continuing for a long time *synonym*: enduring, abiding, durable

(1) **long-lasting** battery, (2) a **long-lasting** friendship They finally decided to solve the **long-lasting** problem.

advantageous

adj. providing a benefit or advantage; favorable or beneficial *synonym*: beneficial, favorable, profitable

(1) advantageous conditions, (2) advantageous interest rate

The new job opportunity offered by the company is highly advantageous.

demonize

- to portray or represent someone or something as evil or wicked, often to create fear or hostility towards them synonym: vilify, condemn, defame
- (1) **demonize** opponent, (2) **demonize** sugar Some politicians try to **demonize** certain groups of people to gain political advantage.

migrant

a traveler who moves from one region or country to another, especially to find work or better living conditions; a bird or an animal that moves from one place to another

synonym: immigrant, itinerant, transient

(1) migrant worker, (2) the movement of migrant birds The government revoked his license to employ migrant labor crews.

politicize

to make something political or to involve it in politics, often for personal or ideological gain or to influence public opinion

synonym: politize, exploit, manipulate

(1) **politicize** climate change, (2) **politicize** a tragedy I wish people would stop trying to **politicize** fundamental human rights issues.

orderly

adj. clean or organized in a neat, careful and logical way synonym: tidy, tidied, neat
