cryptocurrency

- any system of electronic money that does not rely on any central authority to uphold or maintain it
- (1) **cryptocurrency** boom, (2) **cryptocurrency** market The **cryptocurrency** community is becoming more diverse every year.

entrepreneurship

n. the process or skill of starting and running a business, particularly a new and innovative one

synonym: self-employment, risk-taking

(1) entrepreneurship culture, (2) embodyentrepreneurship

The government is investing in programs to support **entrepreneurship** and small business development.

intermediary

 a person or organization that acts as a go-between or mediator in negotiations or transactions between two or more parties; a middleman, a broker, or an agent who facilitates communication, trade, or dealings

synonym: middleman, mediator, agent

The **intermediary** between the buyer and the seller helped them agree.

originate

to come into existence in a particular place or situation;

synonym: begin, arise, create

fungible

adj. able to be replaced or exchanged with another identical item; uniform and interchangeable in value or usesynonym: interchangeable, exchangeable, tradable

Gold is a **fungible commodity**, meaning its value is interchangeable with other gold of the same quality and quantity.

revolutionize

The invention of the smartphone **revolutionized** the way we communicate with each other.

monetize

cryptography

 the study of the techniques and methods used for secure communication and information processing, particularly using codes and ciphers

synonym: coding, steganography, encryption

(1) asymmetric **cryptography**, (2) digital **cryptography** The software engineers developed a new **cryptography** algorithm to protect users' data.

decentralize

v. to move the power, control, or authority of an organization, government, or system from a single place to several smaller ones

synonym: deconcentrate, disperse, distribute

(1) **decentralize** authority, (2) **decentralize** organizational structure

We need to **decentralize** our data to recover quickly from a disaster.

blockchain

- a system in which a growing list of payment records, called blocks, made in cryptocurrency is maintained across several computers that are securely linked
- (1) **blockchain** platform, (2) the scalability of **blockchain** Cryptocurrencies are only one form of implementation of **blockchain** technology.

ledger

 a book or computer program used to keep track of financial transactions; a collection of records or accounts kept in such a book or program

synonym: book, register, account

(1) financial **ledger**, (2) personal **ledger**

The auditor checked every entry in the **ledger** for accuracy.

middleman

 a person who acts as an intermediary between two or more parties, often facilitating the exchange of goods or services and taking a commission or fee for their services

synonym: intermediary, agent, broker

(1) trusted **middleman**, (2) business **middleman**The **middleman** in the real estate deal ensured a smooth and fair transaction.

mural

adj. a large painting or other artwork that is applied directly to a wall or other surface

synonym: wall painting, fresco, wall art

The **mural** on the wall depicted the history of the city.

innovate

- v. to introduce new methods, ideas, or products synonym: bring in, introduce, found

Companies developing self-driving cars consistently

sneak

to go somewhere, or take someone or something somewhere secretly or stealthily; to steal or do something secretly or stealthily

synonym: creep, tiptoe, smuggle

augment

snoop

- the state of being in short supply; a small and inadequate amount

scarcity

Some research says that a relative decline in teacher salaries is causing labor **scarcity**.

perpetual

adj. continuing for an extended period in the same way without stopping or being interrupted

synonym: enduring, unchanging, incessant

ethic
