ram

synonym: crash, collide, slam

illiterate

adj. unable to read or write; lacking basic education and knowledge in reading and writing

synonym: unlettered, uneducated, unschooled

(1) illiterate population, (2) computer- illiterate

Despite attending school, he remained **illiterate** and unable to read or write.

industrious

*adj.* hardworking, diligent, and persistent in effort *synonym*: diligent, hardworking, assiduous

(1) industrious worker, (2) industrious student

He was known to be very **industrious** and would often work late into the night.

rev

 a measure of the rate at which an engine or motor rotates, often expressed in revolutions per minute (RPM); (verb) to increase the number of rotations per minute synonym: revolution, RPM, speed

(1) low- rev engine, (2) rev up the crowd

He stepped on the gas pedal, and the engine released a loud **rev**.

#### unseen

adj. not seen or noticed; not perceivedsynonym: invisible, hidden, undercover

(1) unseen danger, (2) an unseen force

The consequences of the pandemic remain **unseen** as scientists continue to research the virus.

#### unheard

adj. not heard, listened to, or noticed; not having been brought to public attention

synonym: unknown, obscure

(1) an **unheard** story, (2) previously **unheard-of** economic development

The **unheard** melody was beautiful and touched everyone's hearts.

#### stereotype

- a fixed and unvarying idea or image that people have about what someone or something is like, but which is often not true in reality and may cause hurt and offense
- avoid stereotype, (2) negative stereotypes
   Changing stereotypes about LGBTQ requires considerable effort.

#### preferential

adj. showing or giving preference or priority to a particular thing or person; giving special treatment or privilege to someone or something

synonym: preferential treatment, biased, partial

(1) **preferential** seating, (2) **preferential** pricing

The **preferential** treatment given to certain employees led to resentment from others in the company.

#### chore

 a routine or tedious task, often related to household or manual labor

synonym: task, duty, job

(1) chore list, (2) household chores

Cleaning the house is a **chore** that only some enjoy.

sibling

 a brother or sister; member of a family born to the same parents

*synonym*: brother, sister, relative

- (1) have a **sibling** quarrel, (2) play with my **siblings** Children often copy their parents or elder **siblings**.
- elope v. to run away secretly to get married, often without the

synonym: run away, abscond, escape

(1) elope secretly, (2) elope together

The young couple decided to **elope** instead of having a traditional wedding ceremony.

consent or knowledge of one's family or friends

nuance

 a subtle or slight degree of difference in appearance, meaning, sound, someone's feeling, etc.

synonym: shading, refinement, subtlety

(1) rich in **nuance**, (2) subtle cultural **nuance** 

The painter has tried to express every **nuance** of the woman's expression in his work.

discreet

adj. characterized by the ability to keep secrets or maintain confidentiality; showing prudence, tact, or reserve in behavior or speech; not likely to draw attention or cause offense

synonym: cautious, careful, circumspect

(1) **discreet** manner, (2) **discreet** conversation

He was **discreet** with the sensitive information he had been entrusted with.

tote

v. to carry or transport something, especially by hand or with some effort; to haul or convey something from one place to another

synonym: carry, haul, transport

(1) tote a cell-phone, (2) tote her books in a colorful

#### backpack

Can you help me **tote** these groceries to the car?

### napkin

 a small piece of cloth or paper used for wiping one's mouth and hands while eating; a decorative cloth placed on a table for formal occasions

synonym: serviette, handkerchief, cloth

(1) paper **napkin**, (2) linen **napkin**I always keep a stack of **napkins** on my desk while I eat to prevent any messes.

#### embarrass

- v. to cause someone to feel awkward, worried, or ashamed synonym: disconcert, unsettle, agitate
- (1) **embarrass** political enemy, (2) **embarrass** my project He looked for an opportunity to **embarrass** that actor in public.

#### unwelcome

adj. not wanted, not invited, or not appreciated; causing annoyance or displeasure

synonym: uninvited, disliked, undesired

(1) **unwelcome** interruption, (2) **unwelcome** surprise

The **unwelcome** visitor quickly made their presence known.

#### menstruate

v. to have or experience the process in a woman's menstrual cycle during which blood and other materials are discharged from the uterus

synonym: period, menstruation, menarche

(1) **menstruate** regularly, (2) failure to **menstruate** The teenage girl began to **menstruate** last month.

#### disrupt

v. to prevent or stop something, especially an event, activity, or process, from continuing in the usual way by causing a problem or disturbance

synonym: interrupt, disturb, break into

(1) **disrupt** a well-ordered condition, (2) **disrupt** sleep I'm so sorry to **disrupt** you when you're pretty busy.

#### abduct

to take someone away illegally to an undisclosed location by force, usually to extract a ransom synonym: kidnap, seize, snatch

(1) abduct a girl, (2) abduct at gunpoint The passerby witnessed the moment the boy was **abducted**.

#### snatch

- to take or grab something suddenly or quickly synonym: grab, seize, capture
- (1) **snatch** a hasty meal, (2) **snatch** up her purse He **snatches** victory from the jaws of defeat in the game's final seconds.

#### berate

to scold or criticize harshly, often in a loud or angry manner; to rebuke or chastise severely

synonym: rebuke, scold, criticize

(1) **berate** him for his mistakes, (2) **berate** a child She would **berate** her husband for not taking out the trash every day.

- to ruin the taste, appearance, or quality of something; to become or cause something to become rotten or bad synonym: rot, decay, deteriorate
- (1) **spoil** a person's sport, (2) **spoil** the surprise If you leave the milk out of the refrigerator for too long, it will spoil.
