fiery

adj. very intense; like or suggestive of fire *synonym*: igneous, passionate, fervent

(1) a fiery speech, (2) a fiery sunset

He is a man of **fiery** temperament.

livelihood

a means of earning money people need to pay for food, a place to live, clothing, etc.

synonym: occupation, living, income

- (1) a means of **livelihood**, (2) **livelihood** assistance
- I could no longer earn my own livelihood.

seawall

synonym: embankment, breakwater

grandparent

- a parent of one's father or mother

#### seaweed

n. a plant that grows in the sea or on land very close to the sea, especially marine algae

synonym: kelp, algae

# disrespect

 an expression of lack of regard or contempt for someone or something

*synonym*: impoliteness, rudeness, insult

### reintroduce

 to bring back something that has been previously abolished or discontinued

synonym: bring back, restore, reestablish

(1) **reintroduce** species, (2) **reintroduce** capital punishment

The government is planning to **reintroduce** wolves to the national park to restore the balance of the ecosystem.

# decorate

v. to add beauty or distinction to something by the addition of ornament, art, etc

synonym: adorn, embellish, beautify

(1) decorate a wall, (2) decorate for Christmas

They **decorated** the room with balloons and streamers for the birthday party.

# seashell

 a type of shell that once housed a mollusk, typically found on beaches or in shallow water

synonym: shell, conch, bivalve

(1) seashell ornament, (2) a fossil seashell

I love collecting **seashells** on the beach and displaying them in a jar at home.

# lagoon

 a shallow stretch of water separated from a larger body of water by sandbanks or coral reefs; a small saltwater lake near a sea or an ocean

synonym: pond, pool, bayou

(1) lagoon island, (2) lagoon paradise

The mangroves around the **lagoon** provide a habitat for a unique ecosystem

#### seafarer

 a person who works at sea, especially on a merchant ship or a navy vessel; a person who is experienced in sailing or navigating on the sea

synonym: sailor, mariner, navigator

(1) qualified **seafarer**, (2) fellow **seafarer** 

The experienced **seafarer** told stories of his adventures on the high seas.

# adorn

 to make something or somebody more attractive or beautiful

*synonym*: decorate, beautify, embellish

adorn a bride, (2) adorn the table with flowers
The architect adorned the interior with great artworks and frescoes.

# handicraft

n. a skill or trade that involves making things by hand, often using traditional methods and materials, which include activities such as woodworking, sewing, pottery, and weaving

synonym: craft, handmade, artisanry

# calamity

#### seashore

n. the area where land meets the sea, often characterized by sand, rocks, cliffs, and shore flora and fauna

*synonym*: beach, seacoast, shoreline

#### huddle

# submerge

#### saline

*adj.* containing salt; of or relating to chemical salts *synonym*: salty, briny, brackish

# regress

 to move or develop backward; to return to an earlier or less advanced state or condition; to decline or deteriorate

*synonym*: retrovert, deteriorate, decline

(1) regress to childhood, (2) regress in skills

The team's failure to win games has caused them to **regress** in confidence.

# groundwater

water that is present beneath the surface of the ground,
especially in soil or in pores and crevices in rock

synonym: aquifer, well water, underground water

(1) groundwater supply, (2) contaminated groundwater The town's main source of water is natural **groundwater**.

# saltiness

- the quality or state of being salty
- (1) the taste of saltiness, (2) enhance the saltiness She tasted the dish and detected a slight saltiness.

# dispense

to distribute, allocate, or deliver something to the intended recipients

synonym: distribute, allocate, deal out

(1) dispense with ceremony, (2) dispense justice The pharmacist started to **dispense** medication to patients.

#### adamant

- adj. having a very strong determination to do something and refusing to be influenced or persuaded; (noun) a legendary rock that is very hard and impossible to crush *synonym*: resolute, unyielding, obstinate
