sterilize

v. to make something free of all forms of life, especially bacteria or viruses, by using heat, chemicals, or radiation

synonym: disinfect, sanitize, cleanse

(1) **sterilize** chemically, (2) **sterilize** surfaces

The nurse **sterilized** the instruments before the surgery to prevent any infections.

horrific

adj. causing horror or disgust; gruesome and terrifyingsynonym: terrifying, alarming, shocking

(1) horrific experience, (2) horrific condition

The accident scene was **horrific**, with bodies and debris scattered everywhere.

authoritarian

 adj. characterized by strict, absolute control and obedience to authority or rules; dictatorial and lacking in personal freedoms or individual rights

synonym: dictatorial, totalitarian, despotic

(1) **authoritarian** practice, (2) **authoritarian** government The **authoritarian** leadership style left no room for dissent or alternative opinions.

relentless

adj. persistent and determined; continuing despite difficulties or setbacks

synonym: unyielding, tireless, unremitting

(1) **relentless** attack, (2) face **relentless** pressure The athlete's **relentless** training paid off in the end.

eugenic

adj. relating to or promoting the improvement of the human genetic stock, particularly through controlled breeding, to enhance desirable traits among offspring

synonym: improving, genetic engineering, selective breeding

(1) eugenic screening, (2) eugenic movement

That government had once implemented a series of **eugenic** policies to improve the population's genetic makeup.

trait

n. a particular feature of your nature

synonym: attribute, feature, quality

(1) chemical trait, (2) personality traits

Multiple genes may influence behavioral **traits** concurrently.

dedicate

v. to give all of your energy, time, etc., entirely to a specific person, activity, or cause; to set apart for a particular purpose or use

synonym: consecrate, devote, commit

(1) **dedicate** a few hours, (2) **dedicate** a chapter to the subject

He **dedicated** his life to helping others.

reformer

a person who makes changes to a system or law to improve it

synonym: inciter, innovator, agitator

(1) education **reformer**, (2) catalytic **reformer**

He is regarded as a passionate social reformer.

determinant

 a factor, circumstance, or condition that contributes to the shaping, influencing, or determining of a particular outcome or result

synonym: cause, factor, element

(1) environmental **determinant**, (2) a **determinant** of crop yields

One **determinant** of success is having a positive attitude and a strong work ethic.

unfit

adj. not suitable or good enough for a particular purpose or standard

synonym: inadequate, unsuitable, improper

(1) unfit for the post, (2) physically unfit

The doctor declared him unfit for work due to his illness.

outlaw

 to make something illegal; (noun) a person who has committed a crime or has been legally convicted of a crime synonym: ban, prohibit, (noun) bandit

(1) **outlaw** racial discrimination, (2) **outlaw** cloning of human cells

Some communities began to **outlaw** alcohol consumption.

enact

- v. to make a law; to put something into practicesynonym: legislate, pass, decree
- (1) **enact** new legislation, (2) **enact** the smoking ban The government **enacted** this law in 1925.

forcibly

adv. done by physical power or violence; against someone's will

synonym: violently, roughly, aggressively

(1) **forcibly** remove, (2) **forcibly** taken into a car The police officer **forcibly** removed the protesters from the public park.

deem

- v. to consider or decide something in a particular waysynonym: believe, consider, suppose
- (1) **deem** socially responsible, (2) **deem** wrong or inappropriate

Regarding earthquakes, some commercial buildings were **deemed** unsafe.

superficial

viol

 synonym: viola, viola da gamba, string instrument

The **viol** player was rehearsing for an upcoming concert.

deprive

- v. to take away something from someone synonym: deny, take away, divest
- (1) **deprive** others of profit, (2) **deprive** him of his status He was **deprived** of his freedom when sentenced to life in prison.

impending

nuanced

adj. characterized by subtle differences in appearance, meaning, sound, etc.

synonym: fine, subtle, slight

(1) **nuanced** view, (2) the common but **nuanced** opinion The sommelier can distinguish **nuanced** variance in the flavor of the wine.

bioethics

n. the study of ethical issues related to life sciences and healthcare, particularly those related to the moral implications of scientific advances in medicine and biology

synonym: medical ethics, bio-morality

Using animals in medical research raises complex questions
about **bioethics** and animal welfare.

oppress
