### affluent

adj. rich and wealthy; having a lot of money and material wealth

synonym: wealthy, rich, prosperous

(1) **affluent** society, (2) live in **affluent** circumstances She lived in an **affluent** neighborhood surrounded by wealth and luxury.

## ripple

 a small wave on the surface of a liquid, typically caused by an object falling into it or a slight wind

synonym: wave, undulation, fluctuation

a ripple of laughter, (2) ripple in the water
 Many businesses felt the ripple effect of the economy's decline.

#### harass

v. to annoy, torment, or pester persistently; to subject someone to repeated or chronic attacks or unwelcome attention

synonym: pester, annoy, bother

(1) **harass** the enemy, (2) **harass** with constant criticism She was constantly **harassed** by her ex-boyfriend and had to get a restraining order.

#### wildfire

 a large, uncontrolled fire that spreads quickly through a natural area such as a forest, grassland, or mountain slope

synonym: blaze, bonfire, flame

(1) **wildfire** spread, (2) arson-caused **wildfire**The **wildfire** destroyed hundreds of homes and forced thousands of people to evacuate.

## segregate

v. to separate or set apart from others, often based on race, gender, or some other characteristic

synonym: isolate, separate, divide

(1) **segregate** by race, (2) **segregate** boys and girls The school board decided to **segregate** students by the ability to meet their needs better.

## encompass

- v. to surround or cover something completely; to include a large number of or different types of things entirelysynonym: surround, encircle, include
- (1) **encompass** a broad range, (2) **encompass** the enemy The optimal solution that would **encompass** all these elements has yet to be proposed.

## underwrite

- v. to assume financial responsibility for something synonym: insure, guarantee, cover
- (1) **underwrite** a loan, (2) **underwrite** an issue of shares
  The insurance company decided to **underwrite** the policy for the new building.

#### outset

- n. the beginning of somethingsynonym: beginning, start, initiation
- (1) month's **outset**, (2) the **outset** of the crisis
  At the **outset** of the project, we encountered several obstacles.

## postwar

 adj. relating to the period following a war, particularly World War II; characterized by the rebuilding and recovery of countries and societies synonym: subsequent, aftermath

(1) **postwar** years, (2) **postwar** society

The **postwar** period was marked by economic growth and rebuilding efforts.

pave

 to cover something with a hard, flat material such as stones, bricks, or concrete, to make it suitable for travel or use

synonym: surface, coat, cover

(1) **pave** a new path, (2) **pave** a smoother road They **paved** the courtyard with bricks, giving it a more polished appearance.

guzzle

v. to drink something quickly, greedily, and usually in large amounts.

synonym: gobble, carouse, quaff

(1) guzzle beer, (2) guzzle their food

They **guzzled** the cheap vodka.

diffuse

adj. spread out widely; not concentrated in one place synonym: spread, scatter

(1) diffuse bleeding, (2) diffuse cloud

Direct lighting is preferable to diffuse lighting when reading.

necessitate

v. to make something necessary or essential; to require something as a condition or consequence

synonym: require, demand, entail

(1) **necessitate** compromise, (2) **necessitate** action The new law will **necessitate** changes in our current procedures.

quadruple

- v. to consist of four items or people; to become four times as great or many
- (1) **quadruple** the amount, (2) **quadruple** the price of gold His stock earnings **quadrupled**.

#### redline

 a boundary or threshold beyond which something is no longer acceptable or allowed; a mark or line drawn in red to indicate a specific limit or danger zone

synonym: boundary line, deadline, limit

(1) redline speed, (2) redline level

The neighborhood was affected by a **redline** drawn by real estate agents to keep specific populations out.

#### boast

 to talk about someone's accomplishments, wealth, or abilities excessively with undue pride and self-satisfaction

synonym: show off, brag, bluster

(1) **boast** of his success, (2) **boast** a long history This town **boasts** a national park.

## freeway

 a major highway designed for high-speed traffic, with no stoplights or grade crossings and having interchanges or access roads to other highways

synonym: highway, expressway, motorway

(1) freeway exit, (2) expanded freeway

We got stuck in a traffic jam on the **freeway** for over an hour.

## disproportionately

adv. in a way that is not reasonably or appropriately balanced, equal, or distributed; in a manner that is unequal or excessive about something else

synonym: excessively, unequally

(1) **disproportionately** affected, (2) **disproportionately** high

The rich can often **disproportionately** benefit from tax breaks and other advantages.

#### industrious

adj. hardworking, diligent, and persistent in effort synonym: diligent, hardworking, assiduous

(1) **industrious** worker, (2) **industrious** student He was known to be very **industrious** and would often work late into the night.

#### steer

- v. to control the direction or movement of a vehicle; to direct a course of action; to guide or motivate someonesynonym: guide, direct, control
- (1) **steer** a steady course, (2) **steer** a conversation The captain told him to **steer** the ship north.

### inaccessible

- *adj.* unable to travel to or reach; not available *synonym*: inapproachable, unreachable, remote
- (1) **inaccessible** to an unauthorized user, (2) **inaccessible** areas

Heavy snow made it **inaccessible** to go to the mountain village.

## gentrify

v. to renovate, revitalize, or develop a deteriorated, predominantly urban area, often leading to the displacement of low-income or minority residents and the influx of more affluent residents and businesses

synonym: revitalize, renovate, renew

(1) **gentrify** a community, (2) **gentrify** a street

The new coffee shops and high-end boutiques are starting to **gentrify** the neighborhood.

## exclusionary

 adj. tending to exclude or keep out certain groups, individuals, or ideas; characterized by the exclusion of others

synonym: discriminatory, exclusive, selective

(1) **exclusionary** clause, (2) **exclusionary** practices The new housing development faced criticism for its **exclusionary** policies towards lower-income residents.

## displace

v. to force someone or something to leave their home or place of origin, especially as a result of conflict, natural disaster, or manipulation

synonym: evict, exile, remove

(1) **displace** workers, (2) **displace** the explosive power The construction of the new dam will **displace** hundreds of families living downstream.

#### etch

v. to carve, cut, or engrave (a design or text) into a hard surface; to corrode, erode or eat away at a metal surface using acid or another chemical substance to create a design or pattern

synonym: engrave, inscribe, carve

(1) **etch** a metal plate, (2) **etch** a design into wood He used a sharp tool to **etch** his initials onto the metal.

## pristine

adj. new and completely free from dirt or contaminationsynonym: chaste, pure, immaculate

(1) **pristine** beach, (2) maintain the **pristine** condition It is terrific to camp in **pristine** nature.

#### footnote

 a note of additional information provided at the bottom of a page in a book or document, often indicated by a superscript number or symbol in the main text

synonym: annotation, comment, reference

(1) **footnote** citation, (2) add a **footnote**I included a **footnote** in my essay to provide additional information and sources for my argument.

## insidious

adj. tending to entrap or beguile unawares; working or spreading in a hidden and usually harmful waysynonym: sly, cunning, subtle

(1) **insidious** plot, (2) **insidious** behavior The disease has an **insidious** onset, making it difficult to diagnose.
