#### fallacy

#### contort

#### indefensible

n. a false belief or impression that is firmly held despite evidence to the contrary

synonym: hallucination, illusion, fantasy

(1) grand **delusion**, (2) labor under a **delusion** He had a **delusion** that he was a millionaire.

#### perpetuate

- v. to make something continue or prevail for a long time synonym: eternalize, preserve, maintain
