encourage

v. to give someone support, confidence, or hope; to persuade someone to do or continue to do something by making it easier for them and making them believe it is a good thing to do

synonym: facilitate, persuade, stimulate

They **encouraged** customers with a premium for loyal patronage.

assault

 a violent physical attack; the crime of forcing someone to submit to sexual intercourse against their will

synonym: assault, attack, raid

overturn

v. to turn something upside down; to upset

synonym: flip over, upset, topple

(1) **overturn** a decision, (2) **overturn** a table

The court **overturned** the original verdict.

elect

v. to choose someone for a specific position by voting for them; to decide or choose to do something

synonym: select, choose, prefer

(1) **elect** the school board, (2) **elect** death

Every five years, the provincial governors are **elected**.

bunch

 a grouping of several similar things which are growing or fastened together

synonym: group, assemblage, bundle

(1) a **bunch** of trees, (2) a **bunch** of schoolgirls

One bad apple spoils the whole **bunch**.

retreat

 the act of moving back or withdrawing from a position or situation; a period of rest or relaxation away from work or everyday life

synonym: escape, withdrawal, vacation

process

ballot

judicial

adj. of or relating to a court, a judge, or legal judgment synonym: legal, juridical, judicatory

worrisome

 adj. causing worry, trouble, or anxiety; indicating the possible presence of danger, difficulty, or harm

old-fashioned

adj. of or relating to a time in the past; not modern synonym: antiquated, ancient, outdated

government

 the group of people with authority to control a country or state

synonym: administration, regime, state

superior

adj. better, higher in quality, or more advanced than others synonym: better, greater, exceptional

(1) **superior** performance, (2) provide **superior** customer service

The new smartphone model is **superior** to the previous version in terms of speed and features.

liberty

n. the state of being free within society from oppressive restrictions imposed by authority on one's way of life, behavior, or political views

synonym: freedom, autonomy, independence

overlook

v. to fail to notice something; to watch over someone; to provide a view from above

 a promise or firm decision to do something or to behave in a certain way

n. the system by which a country or region produces manages, and distributes goods and services, including the money and finances involved in these activities; (of an airline) the lowest-priced, most basic option for seating in commercial travel

evident

adj. apparent to the mind, senses, or judgment

settle

- v. to reach an agreement of disagreement synonym: inhabit, occupy, decide

suppose

- v. to think that something is likely to be actual or possible synonym: guess, assume, presume
- (1) **suppose** you're right, (2) **suppose** beforehand What do you **suppose** the culprit's motive was?

grab

 to take hold of something or someone suddenly with a hand, especially in a violent way

synonym: clutch, snatch, grasp

(1) **grab** an audience, (2) **grab** an opportunity Shall we **grab** a bite to eat?

patriot

 a person who loves their nation and would fight for it if required

synonym: nationalist, loyalist

grandparent

- n. a parent of one's father or mother

relative

adj. considered and evaluated through comparison with something else

overcrowded

 adj. lacking sufficient resources, especially financial or material support, to carry out a particular task, project, or mission

violent

adj. involving or caused by physical force or aggression against someone or something

permit

v. to allow for something to happen or be done; (noun) the act of giving a formal, usually written, authorization

temporary

adj. not lasting or be used for a very long synonym: provisional, short-term, interim

preparation

n. the activity of getting ready for something or making something ready

faith

 a deep conviction in a supernatural power that controls human destiny

synonym: faith, creed, belief

 religion sociology, (2) freedom of religion
 Their religion strictly prohibits them from drinking or gambling.

civic

adj. of or relating to a town, city, or the people who live in it synonym: community, civic, communal

(1) civic activity, (2) civic center

The city promotes **civic** collaboration in community

development

lift

v. to raise something to a higher position or level; to pick up something or somebody and move them to a different position

synonym: raise, elevate, move up

(1) **lift** sagging skin, (2) **lift** a ban on alcohol The drought **lifted** the prices of grain globally.

circumstance

the specific conditions or events that surround a particular situation or occurrence

synonym: condition, context, environment

(1) **circumstance** of birth, (2) **circumstance** of injury

She explained the **circumstances** surrounding the accident.

symbol

something visible that is used to represent something else

synonym: mark, character, insignia

(1) **symbol** color, (2) **symbol** for happiness The dragon is considered a **symbol** of bravery.

patriotism

n. love and loyalty to one's country

synonym: nationalism, loyalty, devotion

the spirit of patriotism, (2) fanatic patriotism
 actions were a testament to his deep love and patriotism for his country.

tricky

adj. requiring care and skill because challenging to do or deal with

synonym: thorny, problematic, crafty

tricky problem, (2) a tricky recipe to follow
 we have discussed the entirety of this tricky problem.

deny

v. to state that one refuses to admit the existence or truth of something

synonym: refute, reject, repudiate

(1) adamantly **deny** killing, (2) **deny** the allegations

He is still **denying** stealing the money from the cash register.

lynch

v. to put to death or punish (usually by hanging) without legal authorization or due process, often as an act of mob justice or vigilante action; (noun) a violent punishment, often extrajudicial, in which a mob or group of people seize and kill someone, usually by hanging, as a form of punishment or vengeance

synonym: hang, execute, mob

(1) lynch law, (2) lynch him to death

The mob wanted to **lynch** the suspect before he could be tried in court.

military

adj. relating to or characteristic of members of the armed forces; of or relating to war or warfare

uniform

adj. always the same; showing a single form or character in all occurrences; (noun) the special set of clothes worn by members of a particular group as a means of identification

laborer

 a person who works hard physically, typically doing unskilled or manual labor; a worker or employee who performs physically demanding tasks

synonym: worker, employee, operative

The construction site hired many **laborers** to help with the heavy lifting.

voter

 a person who votes or has a legal right to vote in a political election

synonym: elector, citizen

(1) an eligible voter, (2) voter apathy

The election administration nullified the election results because of **voter** fraud.

policy

a set of rules, guidelines, principles, or procedures that govern decision-making or action, often used in the context of business or government; a course of action or plan of action adopted or followed by an organization or individual to achieve a goal or objective

synonym: strategy, plan, guideline

The company's new **policy** on remote work has made it a more inclusive workplace.

grandchild

- n. a child of someone's son or daughtersynonym: offspring, descendant, progeny

The loud bang outside the window caused him to **startle** and spill his coffee.

confuse

v. to mistake one thing for another; to make somebody hard to understand

synonym: confound, obscure, disorient

(1) **confuse** the listener, (2) **confuse** fantasy with reality Her remarks **confused** the debate.

attribute

v. to say or regard that something is the result of a particular thing; (noun) a quality or feature that someone or something possesses;

synonym: ascribe, blame, (noun) feature

(1) **attribute** the change to their marriage, (2) **attribute** directly to sales

He **attributes** the disappointing results to the economic downturn.

preppy

- n. a person, often young and affluent, who adopts or represents a fashion style associated with the culture of the northeastern United States; a fashion style characterized by conservative and classic clothing often associated with upscale or Ivy League school attire
- preppy style, (2) private preppy school
 Polo shirts and penny loafers characterize the preppy look.

patriotic

 adj. having or showing love for one's country and a desire for its success and welfare

synonym: loyal, chauvinistic, jingoistic

strike

- v. to wallop somebody or something with the hand, fist, or weapon; to have an emotional or cognitive impact upon synonym: hit, impact, influence

absurd

adj. ridiculously silly, unreasonable, or illogical *synonym*: ridiculous, foolish, idiotic

lapel

n. the flat or folded part of the collar on a suit coat or other jacket that is turned back against the neck; a similar broad part of a garment, typically one that is not turned up

He adjusted the pin on his **lapel** before giving his speech.

flyover

 a region or area of a country that is often flown over by planes and not typically visited or considered by travelers; a flight that passes over a specific area without stopping

synonym: overpass, bridge, flypast

The city's new **flyover** allows traffic to bypass the busy intersection below.

argument

 a set of statements or reasons used to support or refute a proposition or theory; a verbal or physical fight or dispute

synonym: debate, discourse, discussion

(1) a blazing **argument**, (2) the **argument** against capital punishment

The **argument** between the two sides over the proposed policy was heated.

aspiration

 a strong desire to achieve something; the action or process of drawing breath

synonym: ambition, inhalation, intake

(1) no **aspiration** for fame, (2) **aspiration** into the lungs He has an **aspiration** to become a doctor.

geography

n. a field of science devoted to the study of the lands, features, inhabitants, and phenomena of the Earth synonym: landscape, terrain, topography

(1) **geography** class, (2) economic **geography**

She did well on her geography exam.

define

 to state or explain precisely the nature, scope, or meaning of something

synonym: characterize, depict, express

(1) define a word, (2) define my position

To advance this discussion, we must **define** "success" rigorously.

struggle

 to make a great effort to do something when it is difficult, or there are a lot of problems; to use force or violence to break away from restraint or constriction

synonym: toil, strive, compete

(1) **struggle** against discrimination, (2) **struggle** to get the job

He could not struggle against temptation.

opportune

adj. suitable or happening at a time that is suitable or convenient for a particular purpose

synonym: suitable, timely, practical

(1) **opportune** occasion, (2) an **opportune** remark The phone rang at the most **opportune** time.

magnet

 an object or substance that can attract certain materials, such as iron or steel

synonym: magnetite, lodestone, attracting substance

(1) magnet attraction, (2) permanent magnet

The MRI machine uses **magnets** to produce images of the body's internal organs.

talent

 a natural ability to be good at something; someone who has a natural ability to be good at something

synonym: endowment, aptitude, capability

(1) a person of diverse **talents**, (2) raw **talent**Numerous great professional sports **talents** have come from this city.

countless

adj. too numerous to be counted or very many *synonym*: innumerable, myriad, numerous

(1) **countless** hours, (2) answer **countless** questions There are **countless** methods for dealing with stress.

background

- n. the details of a person's social heritage, such as family, vocational or educational experience; past information that is essential to understanding a situation or problem
 synonym: ground, experience, backdrop
- (1) a **background** color, (2) a criminal **background**The company's hiring criteria emphasize personality, not a person's **background**.

flaw

 a fault, mistake, or weakness that causes something not to be perfect

synonym: defect, fault, imperfection

(1) a minor **flaw**, (2) the **flaw** in the legislation Even the slightest design **flaw** in an aircraft can lead to a fatal accident.

conscience

- a person's inner sense of what is right or wrong in their conduct or motives, viewed as a guide to their behavior
 synonym: morality, ethics, scruples
- (1) inner **conscience**, (2) guilty **conscience**He couldn't bear the thought of acting against his **conscience**, even if it meant losing the job.

context

 the circumstances, facts, or conditions that surround a particular event, situation, or statement and that give it meaning

synonym: background, setting, environment

It's important to understand the **context** of a situation before making a decision.

cage

a structure made of metal bars or wire in which birds or animals can be kept

synonym: enclosure, jail, corral

(1) an insect cage, (2) a bird in a cage

The trapped bear is running amok in its cage.

discourage

to make someone lose confidence, enthusiasm, or less willing to do something

synonym: dishearten, depress, demoralize

(1) discourage customers, (2) discourage bacterial growth His parents tried to **discourage** him from becoming an artist.

sanctuary

a place of refuge or safety, especially for victims of persecution or abuse

synonym: refuge, safety, haven

(1) an animal **sanctuary**, (2) violate a **sanctuary** The church offered **sanctuary** to refugees fleeing from

war-torn countries.

bullet

a metal projectile that is shot from a gun

synonym: projectile, slug, shot

(1) **bullet** wound, (2) **bullet** train

The stray **bullet** went through the window and hit the wall.

worship

to have or show a strong feeling of profound respect and admiration for a religious entity such as God or a god

synonym: adore, idolize

(1) worship god, (2) absolutely worship

They traditionally worship their guru.

nightclub

a venue that typically operates late into the night, n. offering music, dancing, and drinks

synonym: discotheque, club, dance hall

(1) **nightclub** entertainment, (2) **nightclub** music

They decided to go to the **nightclub** to dance the night away.

grocery

- n. a shop that sells food and other household itemssynonym: foodstuff, market
- (1) the grocery business, (2) run a groceryI will go to the grocery store to buy food for dinner.

slogan

 a short, catchy phrase or motto that is used by a person, organization, or company to promote a particular product, cause, or idea

synonym: catchphrase, tagline, motto

The company spent months researching and testing different brand **slogans** before finally settling on 'Just Do It' as their new tagline.

lobby

a large area inside the entrance of a public building where people can meet and wait; a group of people who try to persuade a politician, the government, or an official group to influence legislation

synonym: entrance, hall, anteroom

(1) **lobby** for legislation, (2) a hotel **lobby**

That **lobby** group actively advocated environmental protection to the government.

innocent

adj. not guilty of a crime, offense, etc.; not having an evil mind or knowledge

synonym: blameless, honest, harmless

(1) an **innocent** child, (2) thousands of **innocent** people My husband was found **innocent** of any crime.

unarmed

 adj. without weapons or arms; not carrying any form of weapon or ammunition, or engaging in physical conflict with weapons

synonym: defenseless, vulnerable, helpless

(1) unarmed combat, (2) unarmed robbery

The **unarmed** protesters marched peacefully through the streets.

unaccountable

adj. not able to be explained or justified, often in a way that suggests something suspicious or dishonest is going on; not responsible or answerable for one's actions or behavior

synonym: unexplainable, inexplicable, mysterious

(1) **unaccountable** behavior, (2) **unaccountable** decision The **unaccountable** disappearance of funds led to an investigation.

consistent

adj. always behaving or happening in the same way, or having the same thoughts, standards, etc.

synonym: coherent, constant, compatible

shrug

- v. to raise your shoulders and then drop them to say you do not know or are not interested

ceremony

- n. a formal event or ritual, often religious or solemnsynonym: ritual, rite, observance

sanctimonious

 adj. characterized by excessive or hypocritical holiness or righteousness, often to show off one's supposed moral superiority

inconvenient

adj. causing trouble or difficulty; not convenient or suitable synonym: troublesome, difficult, awkward

advantage

 a condition or circumstance that puts one in a favorable or superior position; a beneficial feature or asset that someone or something has

synonym: benefit, edge, asset

(1) score an **advantage**, (2) take **advantage** of his weak points

One of the main **advantages** of the new product is its increased efficiency.

compel

v. to force or require someone to do something; to exert a strong, irresistible force or pressure that makes someone act in a certain way

synonym: force, oblige, coerce

(1) **compel** a person to submission, (2) **compel** attention The strict deadlines will **compel** the team to work efficiently.

compassionate

adj. feeling or showing sympathy and concern for the suffering or bad luck of others

synonym: empathetic, sympathetic, merciful

(1) a **compassionate** heart, (2) **compassionate** leave My father has a serious and **compassionate** personality.

vulnerable

adj. capable of being hurt or influenced physically or mentally

synonym: susceptible, exposed, weak

(1) a **vulnerable** bridge, (2) **vulnerable** parts of the body Infants and pregnant women are particularly **vulnerable**.

despise

to feel strong dislike or contempt for someone or something, often because of a perceived fault or failing; to have a low or unfavorable opinion of something

synonym: hate, loathe, detest

despise a particular food, (2) secretly despise despise injustice and those who perpetrate it.

immigration

 the act or process of coming to live permanently in a foreign country

synonym: migration, settlement, emigration

(1) **immigration** control, (2) **immigration** application The **immigration** policy in this country is stringent, making it difficult for many people to obtain a visa.

hyperpartisanship

n. a state of extreme or excessive loyalty and support for a particular political party or ideology, often to the extent that it becomes difficult to engage in constructive dialogue or compromise with those who hold different views

synonym: polarization, partisanship, factionalism

(1) **hyperpartisanship** politics, (2) **hyperpartisanship** on democracy

willingness
