synonym: scamper, scurry, flee

prowl

scold

to reprimand or criticize someone severely or angrily synonym: reprimand, rebuke, chastise

scoff

(1) **scold** him for being late, (2) **scold** in a loud voice He **scolded** his employees for not meeting their deadlines.

jab

v. to poke or prod someone or something quickly and forcefully with a pointed object or part of the body; to make a sudden or quick thrusting movement; (noun) the act of administering a vaccination or injection with a needle

synonym: poke, prod, thrust

The nurse had to **jab** the patient with a needle to give them the medicine.

cautiously

synonym: carefully, warily, prudently

swell

sting
