#### trauma

 an emotional wound or shock often has long-lasting effects caused by a highly upsetting or shocking

#### experience

synonym: agony, injury, ordeal

(1) psychic trauma, (2) trauma care

Many civilians have suffered **trauma** as a result of the war.

#### essential

*adj.* indispensable; fundamental *synonym*: critical, crucial, basic

(1) **essential** amino acid, (2) **essential** commodities of life Trial and error is an **essential** part of education.

#### booster

 something or someone that supports, promotes, or enhances; a device or substance that improves the performance or effectiveness of something

synonym: promoter, supporter, advocate

#### vaccinate

#### intimate

#### immune
