# colleague

# qualified

# outperform

#### dedicate

 to give all of your energy, time, etc., entirely to a specific person, activity, or cause; to set apart for a particular purpose or use

synonym: consecrate, devote, commit

He **dedicated** his life to helping others.

#### motivate

v. to make someone want to do something, especially something that requires tremendous work and effort

synonym: boost, encourage, inspire

# hardworking

adj. tending to work with a lot of effort and care synonym: diligent, dedicated, conscientious

#### stake

 a share or financial investment in something such as a business; a wooden or metal post set up to mark something

*synonym*: share, interest, post

#### broad

adj. very wide; general

synonym: wide, expansive, comprehensive

synonym: civilize, personalize

#### label

 a small piece of paper, fabric, or other material attached to an object and giving information about it; (verb) to assign to a category

# marginalize

 to treat a person or group as insignificant or unimportant; to push to the edge or margin of society or a group; to exclude from power or influence

It's important not to **marginalize** certain groups of people based on their race, religion, or ethnicity.

# stigmatize

v. to accuse, condemn, or openly or formally consider somebody or something as not deserving respect

She was **stigmatized** by society because she had a child out of wedlock.

# identity

n. the fact of being who or what somebody or something is; the features, emotions, or ideas that distinguish persons from one another

synonym: character, personality, individuality

(1) mistaken **identity**, (2) **identity** as an individual The terrorist's **identity** remains unknown.

# acknowledge

v. to accept or admit the existence, reality, or truth of something; to accept that someone or something has a particular authority or quality; to express obligation, thanks, or gratitude for someone's help, commitment, etc.;

synonym: accept, agree, declare

(1) **acknowledge** the deed, (2) **acknowledge** his help He never **acknowledged** his fault.

#### reclaim

 to take back something previously lost, given, or paid, or ask to have it back

synonym: recoup, regain, retake

#### woodwork

n. the craft or activity of working with wood to create structures or objects; the inner workings or background details of a situation or event that were previously

#### unknown or hidden

The intricate designs on the **woodwork** were hand-carved by a master craftsman.

#### webinar

 a seminar or presentation that is conducted virtually over the internet, usually with an interactive component that allows for audience participation

synonym: web conference, online seminar, virtual workshop

I learned a lot from the webinar on digital marketing.

# struggle

v. to make a great effort to do something when it is difficult, or there are a lot of problems; to use force or violence to break away from restraint or constriction

synonym: toil, strive, compete

(1) **struggle** against discrimination, (2) **struggle** to get the job

He could not struggle against temptation.

#### addiction

 the inability to stop using or doing something as a habit, especially something harmful

*synonym*: dependence

(1) alcohol **addiction**, (2) **addiction** to foreign oil He is now fighting his **addiction** to drugs.

# subsequent

adj. happening or occurring later or after something elsesynonym: later, following, ensuing

(1) over **subsequent** months, (2) reduce **subsequent** mortality

In the **subsequent** meeting, the team discussed ways to improve productivity.

#### convict

v. to prove or declare someone to be guilty of a crime; (noun) a person serving a sentence in a jail or prison

synonym:

# condemn, sentence, judge

(1) **convict** him of manslaughter, (2) **convict** in a jail He was **convicted** on fraud charges and sentenced to five years in prison.

### felony

 a serious crime that carries a punishment of more than one year in prison, typically involving violence or other severe actions

synonym: crime, wrongdoing, offense

Committing a **felony** can result in severe consequences, such as imprisonment or fines.
