If we continue to **deplete** the Earth's natural resources, we will cause severe damage to the environment.

#### rover

 a vehicle designed to travel over rough terrain, especially on the surface of a planet or moon

*synonym*: vehicle, robot, explorer

(1) rover mission, (2) lunar rover

The **rover** on Mars is gathering data on the planet's surface and sending it back to Earth.

#### perseverance

 steadfastness in doing something despite difficulty or delay in achieving success

*synonym*: persistence, tenacity, determination

(1) unwavering **perseverance**, (2) dogged **perseverance**Despite facing numerous setbacks and obstacles, his **perseverance** and determination led him to success.

#### acronym

 a word formed from the first letter of each word in a phrase, such as NASA (National Aeronautics and Space Administration) or AIDS (Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome)

synonym: abbreviation, initialism, shortcut

(1) **acronym** definition, (2) use an **acronym** RADAR is an **acronym** for radio detection and ranging.

## photosynthesis

- n. the process through which plants and other organisms transform light energy into chemical energy, which is then released through cellular respiration to power the organism's activities.
- (1) oxygenic **photosynthesis**, (2) process of **photosynthesis**

In **photosynthesis**, plants use carbon dioxide to feed themselves.

## propellant

 a substance that provides the force to propel (= to cause something to move forwards) something, such as a rocket or spray can

synonym: fuel, driving force, impelling agent

The propellant in the rocket provided the force needed to

reach outer space.

#### volcano

n. a mountain or hill, typically conical, having a crater or vent through which lava, rock fragments, hot vapor, and gas are or have been erupted from the earth's crust.

*synonym*: mount, peak, crater

(1) volcano alert level, (2) active volcano

The island was formed by a volcano millions of years ago.

#### erupt

v. (of a volcano) to become active and eject rocks, smoke, etc.; to start abruptly and violently

synonym: eject, emit, burst

(1) **erupt** in anger, (2) **erupt** into tears

Battles between whites and blacks erupted immediately.

#### asteroid

 a small rocky body orbiting the sun, typically in the region between Mars and Jupiter

synonym: minor planet, planetoid, rocky planetesimal

(1) asteroid mining, (2) asteroid explorer

Scientists are studying the composition and origins of the **asteroid** belt to understand the early solar system better.

#### chuck

v. to throw something carelessly or casually; to get rid of something or someone

synonym: toss, throw, discard

#### far-reaching

*adj.* having a wide or significant impact or influence *synonym*: extensive, widespread, broad

## smartphone

 a mobile phone that functions as a computer and connects to the Internet (1) **smartphone** app developer, (2) **smartphone** addict Internet traffic volumes have increased significantly with the advent of **smartphones**.

#### firefight

 a struggle to extinguish a fire; a military engagement in which small arms and other weapons are used

synonym: battle, conflict, fight

(1) killed in a **firefight**, (2) turn into a **firefight**. The platoon experienced a full-scale **firefight**.

#### purify

v. to remove harmful substances from something and increase the concentration of it

synonym: refine, filter, clarify

(1) **purify** hydrogen gas, (2) **purify** the blood The equipment is frequently used to **purify** and distribute drinking water.

#### spacefaring

n. the act or practice of traveling or exploring outer space, typically to advance scientific knowledge, develop new technologies, or establish a human presence beyond Earth; the ability to travel and explore space

synonym: space navigation, space exploration, spaceflight

(1) **spacefaring** nation, (2) the future of **spacefaring** exploration

**Spacefaring** technology has allowed us to explore the vast expanse of the universe.

#### livable

adj. capable of being lived in comfortably and sustainably;suitable for human habitation

#### birthplace
