synonym: miscarriage

#### overturn

v. to turn something upside down; to upset

synonym: flip over, upset, topple

#### roe

 the eggs or egg-filled ovaries of female fish, typically used as a food item

synonym: fish eggs, caviar, spawn

(1) roe production, (2) salmon roe

The restaurant serves delicious sushi made with fresh roe.

wade

argue

v. to walk through water that is not deep enough to swim in; to struggle or proceed slowly and laboriously through something, such as a difficult situation or a crowd of people

synonym: paddle, trudge, slosh

- (1) **wade** down a street, (2) **wade** through paperwork I had to **wade** through the knee-deep water to get to the other side of the river.
- v. to express differing opinions or points of view, often in a heated or contentious manner; to present a case or reasoning to persuade or convince others

synonym: debate, dispute, quarrel

(1) **argue** a case, (2) **argue** passionately

The couple began to **argue** over which restaurant to go to for dinner.

creditor

- n. a person, company, etc. to whom a debtor owes money
- (1) the **creditor's** claims, (2) bankrupt **creditor** I asked the lawyer to initiate **creditor** negotiations for voluntary liquidation.

cofounder

- one of several people who establishes an organization or starts a business
- (1) cofounder of the university, (2) late cofounderHe is the cofounder and chairman of this tech company.

reproductive

- adj. connected with the process of reproduction; relating to reproducing babies, young animals, or plantssynonym: procreative, generative
- (1) **reproductive** ability, (2) during **reproductive** period This documentary deals with the **reproductive** biology of the buffalo.

#### behalf

- n. represent; advantage, benefit, the interest of someonesynonym: benefit, advantage, favor
- (1) on **behalf** of our management, (2) on his own **behalf** I gave witness on her **behalf**.

# depress

- v. to make someone feel sad, low in spirits, or without hope; to make markets, businesses, etc., less active synonym: sadden, discourage, deflate
- depress their spirits, (2) depress crop prices
   The economic recession depressed the housing market.

#### constitutional

- adj. of or relating to a constitution (= the set of fundamental principles), especially of a country or government;
   existing as an essential characteristic
- synonym: fundamental, basic, inherent
- (1) **constitutional** ban, (2) a **constitutional** disease The right to free speech is a **constitutional** right in the United States.

#### statistics

- n. the discipline that concerns the collection, organization, analysis, interpretation, and presentation of data
- (1) **statistics** for cancer, (2) official **statistics**The **statistics** demonstrate that poverty and unemployment are genuine problems.

#### constitution

- n. the set of fundamental principles or established precedents that a state, a country, or an organization is governed by; the act of forming or establishing something
- synonym: fundamental law, establishment, formation
- (1) the national **constitution**, (2) the national **constitution** When the **constitution** is amended, it often creates a great deal of controversy throughout the country

#### overrule

v. to make a decision or judgment that is different from an earlier one; to overturn or override a decision or action
 synonym: override, countermand, supersede

(1) overrule decision, (2) overrule judgment

The judge **overruled** the objection and allowed the evidence to be presented.

#### undermine

v. to make someone or something less powerful, less effective, weaker gradually; to make someone's fame, confidence, or authority less effective or weaker gradually

synonym: damage, subvert, weaken

(1) **undermine** a good relationship, (2) **undermine** their adversary's reputation

They tried to **undermine** her position by slandering her.

#### unavailable

adj. not able to be used or accessed; not present, able to be found, or able to be contacted

synonym: inaccessible, unobtainable, out of reach

(1) unavailable resource, (2) unavailable option

The professor is currently **unavailable** but will respond to your email as soon as possible

# gasp

v. to inhale sharply and audibly, often in response to strong emotion or sensation; to catch one's breath suddenly, often due to shock or surprise

synonym: breathe, pant, heave

(1) gasp for air, (2) gasp in shock

The audience **gasped** when the magician made the rabbit disappear from the hat.

#### federal

adj. relating to a central government or national authority; refers to government policies, laws, or programs that are implemented at a national level rather than a state or local level

*synonym*: national, central, governmental

(1) **federal** regulations, (2) **federal** funding

The **federal** government announced new regulations to protect the environment.

#### preserve

v. to keep or maintain a particular quality, feature, etc., especially to prevent it from decaying, being damaged, or being destroyed

synonym: conserve, care for, maintain

(1) **preserve** my strength, (2) **preserve** a country's heritage They worked hard to **preserve** the nature of their native lands.

#### decision

 n. the act or process of making up someone's mind about something; a choice or judgment reached after considering options

synonym: choice, determination, judgment

(1) **decision** authority, (2) a selfish **decision**She was struggling to make a **decision** between two job offers.

# gender

n. the range of characteristics of femininity and masculinity and differentiating between them, especially when considering social and cultural differences rather than differences in biology

synonym: sexuality

gender-blind policies, (2) dual gender
 Cultural norms strongly influence gender expectations.

#### decide

- v. to make up someone's mind about something; to come to a conclusion or judgment after considering optionssynonym: choose, determine, settle
- (1) **decide** a question, (2) **decide** on a course of action She couldn't **decide** whether to order the pizza or the pasta for dinner.

# dignity

 the quality of being worthy of esteem or respect; high office or rank or station

synonym: grace, elegance, nobility

(1) respect for human **dignity**, (2) retain everyone's **dignity**. The failure destroyed his trust and personal **dignity**.

#### opponent

*n.* a person against whom you are playing or fighting in a game, competition, debate, etc.

*synonym*: adversary, competitor, enemy

(1) computer **opponent**, (2) death-penalty **opponent** He was attempting to confuse his **opponent**.

#### ban

- v. to officially or legally forbid or refuse to allow something synonym: forbid, prohibit, restrict
- (1) **ban** gender-related job discrimination, (2) **ban** any type of cloning

We should **ban** mildly violent video games from a child's development perspective.

# religion

n. a deep conviction in a supernatural power that controls human destiny

synonym: faith, creed, belief

(1) **religion** sociology, (2) freedom of **religion**Their **religion** strictly prohibits them from drinking or gambling.

#### fetus

- an unborn or unhatched animal in the later stages of development showing the main recognizable features of the mature animal
- (1) development of the **fetus**, (2) an aborted **fetus**The female vagina is elastic enough to allow the passage of a **fetus**.

#### circumstance

the specific conditions or events that surround a particular situation or occurrence

synonym: condition, context, environment

(1) **circumstance** of birth, (2) **circumstance** of injury She explained the **circumstances** surrounding the accident.

# imposing

 adj. having an appearance that commands respect and admiration; impressive or grand in scale or size

synonym: grand, impressive, majestic

(1) **imposing** figure, (2) **imposing** mansion

The **imposing** building stood tall amongst the others on the city skyline.

#### eliminate

- v. to remove or get rid of someone or something synonym: wipe out, destroy, eradicate
- (1) **eliminate** contestants, (2) **eliminate** sexual barriers We can **eliminate** this possibility from those consumptions.

# alarming

- adj. causing concern or apprehension; causing a feeling of danger, harm, or emergency; unsettling or disturbingsynonym: forbidding, concerning, disturbing
- (1) **alarming** news, (2) **alarming** statistics

  The sudden rise in crime rates in our neighborhood is quite **alarming**.

#### infant

- n. a baby or very young childsynonym: baby, newborn, tot
- (1) **infant** daughter, (2) **infant** food Mozart was an **infant** prodigy.

# mortality

- n. the quality or state of being subject to deathsynonym: fatality
- (1) **mortality** due to cancer, (2) lower infant **mortality** This disease has a high **mortality**.

# develop

to grow or expand; to improve or refine through a process of progress and refinement, often to achieve greater sophistication or complexity; to elaborate or add detail to something that is in the process of being created

synonym: evolve, progress, advance

(1) **develop** a strategy, (2) **develop** a skill We must **develop** a new system to streamline our workflow and increase efficiency.

surgery

 medical treatment of injuries or diseases involving an incision with instruments and often removing or replacing some parts of the body; the branch of medical science that treats disease or injury by operative procedures

synonym: operation, (medical) procedure

(1) cardiac **surgery**, (2) the professor of **surgery**He had undergone heart **surgery** years before.

#### procedure

 a way of doing something, especially the official or well-known way

synonym: action, approach, course

(1) undergo a surgical **procedure**, (2) standard **procedure**The pilot and flight attendant ran through the check-out **procedure**.

#### childbirth

- n. the act or process of giving birth to a babysynonym: delivery, labor, parturition
- (1) natural **childbirth**, (2) assisted **childbirth**He was present at the **childbirth** of his children.

#### restriction

- n. a limitation or constraint placed on something, or the act of limiting or constraining somethingsynonym: limitation, constraint, control
- (1) nutritional restriction, (2) restriction on tradeThe restriction on travel during the pandemic made it difficult

# operate

- v. to work in a particular way; to supervise something synonym: work, use, employ
- (1) **operate** 24 hours a day, (2) manually **operate** a machine

This machine is too difficult to **operate** for me.

# participate

- v. to take part in something
- synonym: take part, partake, enter

for people to see their loved ones.

(1) **participate** fully in conversation, (2) **participate** in the program

The majority of students actively **participated** in the college's intramural sports program.

#### **fundamental**

adj. forming an essential base or core from which everything else develops or is affected

synonym: basic, essential, entire

(1) **fundamental** education, (2) **fundamental** rights Human behavior has **fundamental** characteristics.

# destiny

n. the events that will inevitably happen to a particular person or thing in the future

synonym: fate, future, outcome

(1) foreordained **destiny**, (2) **destiny** of the individual It is said that our **destiny** is written in the stars.

#### convinced

 adj. completely certain about something; having a strong belief or conviction in a particular religion

synonym: confident, positive, indoctrinated

(1) **convinced** of the idea, (2) **convinced** criminal The public is **convinced** that the prime minister has committed fraud.

#### radical

adj. relating to the essential aspects of anything; far beyond the norm, mainly used of opinions and actions

synonym: extreme, revolutionary

(1) a **radical** flaw in the plan, (2) a **radical** cure

The government established by the coup was more **radical** than before.

# argument

 a set of statements or reasons used to support or refute a proposition or theory; a verbal or physical fight or dispute

synonym: debate, discourse, discussion

(1) a blazing **argument**, (2) the **argument** against capital punishment

The argument between the two sides over the proposed

policy was heated.

#### confer

v. to have a meeting or discussion to come to a decision or agreement or exchange ideas; to bestow something

synonym: consult, meet, discuss

(1) confer degree, (2) confer honor

The leaders of the two countries met to **confer** on the issue.

# uphold

v. to support or defend something, such as a law, idea, decision, etc.

synonym: defend, maintain, sustain

(1) **uphold** the law, (2) **uphold** tradition

The judge may **uphold** the decision of the lower court.

#### chief

adj. most important or primary; (noun) a person who is in charge

synonym: essential, primary, leading

(1) **chief** accountant, (2) **chief** events of the year Mining is a **chief** source of income for the country.

# justice

 the quality of being fair and reasonable and treating people equally according to their due

synonym: fairness, equity, impartiality

(1) criminal justice, (2) justice of Heaven

The judge's ruling was based on the principles of **justice** and fairness.

#### draft

 a preliminary version of something that is not yet in its final form

synonym: blueprint, outline, rough drawing

(1) a working draft, (2) write the first draft

During debates in the legislature, the **draft** of the law caused a lot of controversies.

# magic

 beliefs and actions employed to influence supernatural beings and forces; any art or performance that invokes supernatural powers synonym: fascination, illusion, wizardry

(1) a magic spell, (2) she is magic

He performed **magic** tricks with sophisticated moves.

#### memoir

 a historical account or biography written from the writer's knowledge of famous people, places, or events

*synonym*: bio, biography

(1) family memoir, (2) publish a memoir

He wrote his **memoirs** while awaiting trial.

# repudiate

- $\nu$ . to reject or disown something or someone
- synonym: reject, disown(1) repudiate a claim, (2) repudiate idea

The government **repudiated** the treaty after the war.

#### joint

adj. shared, held, or made between two or more people;(noun) the point of connection between two bones or elements of a skeleton

synonym: collaborative, cooperative, combined

(1) a joint venture, (2) the bone of a joint

After the summit meeting, the prime ministers issued a **joint** statement.

#### obtain

- v. to get something, especially by making a great effort synonym: accept, acquire, receive
- (1) obtain a license, (2) obtain a bid

# viability

 the ability of something to be successful or to continue to exist

synonym: feasibility, practicability, workability

(1) cellular viability, (2) viability of the business

The project's **viability** was uncertain, so we put it on hold.

# pregnant

adj. having a baby or young animal developing in the uterussynonym: expectant

(1) needs of **pregnant** women, (2) a silence **pregnant** with suspense

She vacated the position when she got **pregnant**.

# territory

- n. an area under the control of a ruler or statesynonym: domain, region, realm
- (1) acquire **territory**, (2) **territory** in charge They incorporated the conquered **territory** into their nation.

#### permit

- v. to allow for something to happen or be done; (noun) the act of giving a formal, usually written, authorizationsynonym: allow, authorize, concede
- (1) **permit** application, (2) work **permit**The teacher will not **permit** any students to leave the

classroom early.

#### enact

- v. to make a law; to put something into practice synonym: legislate, pass, decree
- (1) **enact** new legislation, (2) **enact** the smoking ban The government **enacted** this law in 1925.

#### barrier

 a fence or other obstruction that makes it hard to move or get in; any condition that makes it difficult to make progress or to achieve an objective

synonym: border, barricade, fence

(1) cost barrier, (2) information barrier

The police placed a **barrier** across the street to halt traffic.

#### undue

adj. excessive, unwarranted, or improper; not justified by the circumstances; beyond what is appropriate or reasonable

synonym: excessive, unwarranted, unjustified

(1) **undue** favoritism towards certain industries, (2) **undue** hardship

**Undue** pressure from my boss caused me to feel overwhelmed and stressed.

#### burden

 a duty, responsibility, etc. that is oppressive or worrisome; a load, typically a heavy one that is difficult to carry

synonym: obligation, duty, load

(1) carry a **burden**, (2) **burden** of disease

That car has a low environmental **burden**.

# increasingly

adv. more and more

*synonym*: more and more, progressively

(1) **increasingly** become common, (2) face **increasingly** complicated challenges

Our company found it **increasingly** difficult to keep up with the competition.

#### conservative

adj. holding traditional views and values and opposed to change or innovation

synonym: traditional, reactionary, cautious

(1) a **conservative** society, (2) **conservative** about production

He always makes a **conservative** estimation when predicting future sales.

#### dwindle

v. to gradually decrease in size, amount, or strength; to become smaller

synonym: shrink, decrease, fade

(1) **dwindle** in importance, (2) **dwindle** to almost nothing The crowds at the festival **dwindled** as the night went on.

avail

- v. to help or benefit; to use or take advantage of synonym: help, benefit, serve
- (1) **avail** you little, (2) **avail** ourselves of this opportunity Their financing options are reasonable and easy to **avail**.

# county

an administrative division of a country or state, typically one of several comprising a larger division

synonym: district, region, territory

(1) **county** seat, (2) throughout the **county**The **county's** population has been increasing rapidly in recent years.

#### provider

 a person or an organization that supplies somebody with something needed or wanted

*synonym*: supplier

(1) an information **provider**, (2) the **provider** of the family People select Internet **providers** not only in terms of price but also in terms of transmission speed.

#### rural

adj. of or relating to the countrysidesynonym: agrarian, country, rustic

(1) **rural** accents, (2) people in **rural** areas Many **rural** areas are still impoverished.

#### disabled

 adj. having a physical or mental condition that limits someone's specific actions that most other people can do

synonym: handicapped, impaired, incapacitated

(1) a **disabled** veteran, (2) a learning- **disabled** child She was **disabled** in a car accident.

# difficulty

- n. a condition or state that causes problemssynonym: hardship, complication, problem
- (1) the degree of **difficulty**, (2) **difficulty** in breathing He has **difficulty** exercising because of a back injury sustained in an accident.

#### affordable

adj. not expensive and able to paysynonym: cheap, reasonable, inexpensive

(1) **affordable** housing, (2) **affordable** solution

The automaker has been providing **affordable** car financing options since last year.

#### unfortunately

adv. by bad luck; unluckily

synonym: regrettably, unluckily, alas

(1) **unfortunately** caught in a shower, (2) even more **unfortunately** 

The treatments were done but, **unfortunately**, were unsuccessful.

# pending

adj. awaiting a decision or resolution; yet to be resolved synonym: waiting, undetermined, forthcoming

(1) pending approval, (2) patent pending

I had a **pending** transaction on my credit card.

#### individual

n. a single person or thing, as distinct from a group synonym: person, being, self

(1) a private individual, (2) individual freedom

As an **individual**, he had the right to make his own decisions and live his life as he saw fit.

#### sue

v. to claim a person or organization, especially by filing a legal claim for money or redress

synonym: accuse, plead, file

(1) **sue** a company for damages, (2) **sue** my boss for harassment

He planned to **sue** the organization for negligence.

# vigilant

adj. keeping careful watch for possible danger or difficulties synonym: watchful, attentive, alert

(1) **vigilant** watch, (2) **vigilant** about hand-washing
The guards had to remain **vigilant** to ensure the safety of the high-security facility.

#### bounty

 a reward offered for capturing or killing someone or for accomplishing a specific task

synonym: reward, premium, recompense

(1) cash **bounty**, (2) a **bounty** on exports

The **bounty** hunter was hired to capture the notorious

criminal and bring him to justice.

#### violation

an action that breaches a law, rule, or agreement; an infringement of rights or duties

synonym: breach, transgression, infraction

(1) violation law, (2) commit a traffic violation

The international community has widely condemned the **violation** of human rights.

#### clinic

 a building or hospital department where people can go for medical care or advice, especially of a particular condition

synonym: hospital, infirmary

(1) visit to the veterinary **clinic**, (2) a dental **clinic** She holds a **clinic** on Tuesday mornings.

#### critic

 someone who expresses opinions about the quality of books, music, etc.

synonym: pundit, analyst, attacker

(1) art critic, (2) severe critic

Advocates for legal reform hear less harsh words from their **critics**.

#### stretch

v. to make or be capable of making anything longer or broader without hurting or breaking

*synonym*: lengthen, prolong, extend

(1) **stretch** along the coast, (2) **stretch** a story Some herds have been observed to **stretch** hundreds of kilometers.

#### pro-choice

 adj. advocating for the right of women to have control over their reproductive health and decisions, especially regarding abortion

*synonym*: pro-abortion, pro-reproductive rights, pro-women's choice

(1) **pro-choice** movement, (2) **pro-choice** stance

Those who are **pro-choice** believe in providing women with

access to safe and legal abortions.

# legislator

 a member of a group of people who has the power to make or enact laws

synonym: lawmaker, lawgiver, administrator

(1) a **legislator** appointed by the party, (2) incumbent **legislator** 

Corporate executives and **legislators** are still overwhelmingly men.

# governor

 the person who holds the highest executive office in a state or province

synonym: administrator, executive, leader

(1) **governor** general, (2) a prefectural **governor** 

The state **governor** visited the affected areas and promised to aid the victims.

# medication

 a drug or other form of medicine that treats, prevents, or alleviates the symptoms of the disease

synonym: cure, drug, medicine

(1) antibiotic **medication**, (2) **medication** by mouth The pharmacist not only prescribes the **medication** but also guides its proper use.

#### criminal

- n. a person who has committed a crimesynonym: offender, lawbreaker, delinquent
- (1) wanted **criminal**, (2) **criminal** investigation The police are searching for the **criminal** who stole the jewels.

# prosecution

n. the act of bringing legal charges against someone for a crime they are accused of committing; the legal team responsible for presenting the case against the defendant in a criminal trial

synonym: trial, lawsuit, legal action

(1) criminal **prosecution**, (2) wrongful **prosecution** 

The judge denied the motion to dismiss the **prosecution's** case.

#### unintended

adj. not planned or meantsynonym: accidental, unconsenting, involuntary

(1) **unintended** bias, (2) **unintended** misunderstanding Excessive human interference in the global environment may bring **unintended** consequences.

# strategy

 a detailed plan of action designed to achieve a long-term or overall goal.

synonym: approach, procedure, scenario

(1) military strategy,(2) develop a strategyOur plan includes a comprehensive marketing strategy.

#### feasible

adj. capable of being or likely to be made, done, or achieved synonym: achievable, possible, attainable

(1) economically **feasible**, (2) **feasible** assumption It is not **feasible** and inefficient to complete many tasks at once.

#### quitter

 a person who gives up easily or does not have the determination to finish what they have started

synonym: coward, deserter, surrender

(1) easy quitter, (2) serial quitter

He was labeled as a **quitter** after he abandoned the project halfway.

#### marble

n. a hard crystalline metamorphic rock that has a pattern of lines going through it and takes a high polish used for sculpture and as building material; a small ball made of stone, especially one used in children's games

synonym: stone, rock, sphere

(1) marble statues, (2) artificial marble

The floor was made of white and black **marble** arranged in a checkerboard pattern.

#### staircase

 a set of stairs inside a building, usually with posts and bars that are fixed at the side

synonym: stairway, stairwell

(1) spiral **staircase**, (2) beetle up the **staircase**She walked urgently down the emergency **staircase**.

#### propose

- v. to make a proposal, declare a plan for something synonym: suggest, offer, recommend
- (1) **propose** the amendment, (2) **propose** changes I want to **propose** a toast in honor of our longstanding relationship.

#### movement

 a group of people working together to achieve a shared goal, especially a political, social, or artistic one; the process of moving or being moved, physically or figuratively

synonym: motion, progression, action

(1) a circular **movement**, (2) **movement** of troops

The **movement** of the dancers on stage was graceful and elegant.

# belong

v. to be the property of someone or something; to be a member or part of a group; to be in the proper or appropriate place

*synonym*: fit, be appropriate, be suitable

(1) **belong** to different species, (2) **belong** to a group All the books in this section **belong** to the library's rare collection and must be handled carefully.

coalition

 a temporary alliance formed by two or more political parties for combined action; the state of being combined into one body

synonym: union, confederation, alliance

(1) a three-party **coalition**, (2) **coalition** forces

The two largest opposition parties announced they would form a **coalition** in the next elections.

#### elect

v. to choose someone for a specific position by voting for them; to decide or choose to do something

synonym: select, choose, prefer

(1) elect the school board, (2) elect death

Every five years, the provincial governors are **elected**.

#### congress

 a formal meeting of the representatives of different countries, constituent states, organizations, trade unions, political parties, or other groups

synonym: legislature, parliament, assembly

(1) an international **congress**, (2) peace **congress Congress** must consider this proposal in an unusual situation.

# champion

someone who has won first place in a competition;
 someone who fights for a specific group of people or a belief

synonym: victor, winner, fighter

(1) a **champion** of peace, (2) the grand **champion** The **champion** bicyclist outrode all his competitors.

# politically

adv. in a way that relates to the government or public affairs of a nation

(1) **politically** advantageous, (2) become **politically** savvy This newspaper is supposed to be **politically** neutral.

#### wrest

v. to forcibly take or pull something away from someone or something else; to obtain something with great effort or struggle; to twist or contort something

synonym: seize, snatch, grab

(1) **wrest** information from the reluctant witness, (2) **wrest** control of the city

The politician tried to **wrest** the microphone from the moderator during the heated debate.

rein

 a long, narrow strap attached to a horse's bit, used to control the animal while riding; a means of controlling or limiting something or someone's actions and behavior; (verb) to control or restrain something, especially something that is becoming excessive or out of control

synonym: strap, harness, headstall

(1) tight rein, (2) rein in costs

The new driver struggled to keep a firm grip on the **rein** as the horse bolted.

#### government

 the group of people with authority to control a country or state

synonym: administration, regime, state

(1) **government** bureaucracy, (2) **government** funding The federal **government** is planning to increase taxes for the next fiscal year.

# oppose

- to be against or in conflict with something or someone; to resist or to try to prevent something from happening
- synonym: match, resist, confront
- oppose a decision, (2) publicly oppose
   strongly oppose the new proposed law that would harm our environment.

# agenda
