#### mangrove

- a tropical coastal tree or shrub that grows in saline soil and has prop roots that help to stabilize it

The **mangrove** trees are known for their ability to survive in saltwater and sandy soil.

#### interplay

the way in which two or more things interact or influence each other

synonym: interaction, give-and-take, interconnection

#### subside

to become less intense or widespread; to sink to a lower level

synonym: decrease, decline, diminish

- (1) **subside** an argument, (2) **subside** after a short time The storm **subsided**, leaving the town in peace.
- to force someone or something to leave their home or place of origin, especially as a result of conflict, natural disaster, or manipulation

synonym: evict, exile, remove

#### displace

#### trade-off

 a balance achieved between two desirable but incompatible features; an exchange that occurs as a compromise

synonym: compromise, balance, exchange

#### livelihood

a means of earning money people need to pay for food,
a place to live, clothing, etc.

*synonym*: occupation, living, income

#### inaction

 the lack of action or activity; the state of not doing anything; the failure to take action when action is needed

synonym: idleness, passivity, inertia

#### exacerbate

- v. to make a situation, problem, or feeling worse synonym: worsen, aggravate, escalate

#### relocate

v. to move or move something or someone to a new place and build a house or a business there

synonym: emigrate, resettle, migrate
