snore

chainsaw

The lumberjack used his **chainsaw** to chop through the tree's thick trunk.

originate

to come into existence in a particular place or situation;

synonym: begin, arise, create

The flight **originates** in Vancouver.

airway

n. the air passage from the nose and throat to the lungs; a designated route followed by airplanes flying from one airport to another

synonym: air passage, air duct, skyway

(1) airway blockage, (2) airway beacon

When performing lifesaving, the first step is to secure the airway.

congest

exacerbate

apnea

Sleep **apnea** is a severe condition that causes a person to stop breathing while asleep.
