unreliable

adj. not able to be trusted or depended on *synonym*: inconsistent, erratic, undependable

(1) prove **unreliable**, (2) **unreliable** source of information By incorrect assumption, statistics can be notoriously **unreliable**.

industrialize

- v. to organize the production of something into an industry synonym: motorize
- (1) **industrialize** service, (2) **industrialized** textile production

The nations of South East Asia will quickly **industrialize** and catch up with the West.

debatable

adj. open to discussion or argument; capable of being disputed or doubted

synonym: questionable, uncertain, open to discussion

(1) the validity of the theory is **debatable**, (2) **debatable** topic

Whether or not extraterrestrial life exists is still **debatable** among scientists.

long-range

adj. relating to or extending over a long distance, period of time, or range of possibilities

synonym: far-reaching, extended, distant

(1) **long-range** radar, (2) **long-range** weather forecast The military uses **long-range** missiles to hit targets from far away.

biofuel

 a fuel produced from organic matter, such as crops or waste material, that can be used to replace or supplement traditional fossil fuels

synonym: renewable energy, green fuel, alternative fuel

(1) **biofuel** production, (2) **biofuel** technology
The airplane was powered by a **biofuel** made from plant-based materials.

deforest

v. to clear an area of forest or trees

synonym: clear-cut, strip, denude

(1) **deforest** a mountain, (2) **deforest** millions of acres

The company planned to **deforest** a large rainforest area to make way for a new plantation.

bioenergy

 energy derived from biomass materials, such as plants or organic waste, that can be converted into a usable form of heat, electricity, or fuel

synonym: green energy

(1) bioenergy potential, (2) bioenergy plant

Bioenergy production can be achieved through various methods, such as anaerobic digestion and combustion.

imperfectly

adv. in a faulty or incomplete way

synonym: amiss, insufficiently, clumsily

(1) **imperfectly** developed, (2) **imperfectly** known disease He created an **imperfectly** shaped torso.

synthesize

v. to combine a substance to make a more complex product or compound

synonym: incorporate, amalgamate

(1) **synthesize** molecules, (2) **synthesize** information The spider can **synthesize** multiple different silk proteins.

ammonia

- a compound of nitrogen and hydrogen that forms a gas with a strong smell, used as cleaning substances, fertilizers, and explosives
- (1) **ammonia** water, (2) inhale **ammonia** fumes
 The advent of **ammonia** fertilizers markedly increased agricultural productivity.

sequester

v. to take temporary possession of someone's property until a debt is paid.

synonym: isolate, set apart, segregate

- (1) **sequester** ten percent of the annual carbon emissions,
- (2) sequester myself from the world

He approved their requests to **sequester** the jury.

desalination

- n. the process of removing salt, especially from seawater
- (1) shut down a **desalination** plant, (2) water **desalination** He worked on improving the equipment using the freeze-**desalination** method.

decarbonize

v. to stop or reduce emitting carbon gases, especially carbon dioxide, by replacing energy made from fossil fuels with renewable energy

synonym: decoke, decarburise, decarburize

tinker

 to make repairs, adjustments, or improvements to something, especially in an experimental or makeshift way

synonym: fiddle, play, fix

unhelpful

geothermal

adj. relating to or produced by the internal heat of the earth; often used to refer to energy produced by tapping into the natural heat of the earth

synonym: underground, thermal, subterranean

homes and buildings.

wary

adj. cautious or distrustful, especially because of a previous bad experience

synonym: cautious, suspicious, leery

pollute

v. to make an area or substance, such as land, air, water, etc., dirty or harmful to living things by adding waste matter or harmful chemicals

synonym: contaminate, corrupt, degrade
