The presence of certain substances triggered the **autoimmune** response.

paralysis

 a condition in which you are unable to move or lose control of part or most of the body because of illness or injury

synonym: immobility, stiffness, palsy

rethink

v. to consider again a plan, idea, etc., especially to change it

synonym: reexplore, review, reconsider

(1) **rethink** a marketing plan, (2) **rethink** the role of the manager

We have to **rethink** our company's product lineup for further growth.

coworker

 a person who works with another in the same company or organization

synonym: colleague, peer, associate

inaccessible

adj. unable to travel to or reach; not available synonym: inapproachable, unreachable, remote

porous

adj. having many small holes and being able to absorb or pass through fluids

synonym: permeable, spongy, absorbent

biomaterial

- a substance, usually synthetic, that is used for medical or veterinary purposes and is designed to mimic or replace biological tissues
- (1) **biomaterial** development, (2) **biomaterials** industry The new **biomaterials** used in implants are more durable and less likely to cause an immune response.

inflame

v. to cause very strong feelings such as anger or excitement in a person or a group of people

synonym: agitate, arouse, enrage

(1) **inflame** skin, (2) **inflame** his passion Her eyes **inflamed** with crying.

innocuous

adj. not harmful or dangerous; unlikely to cause injury or damage

synonym: harmless, innocent, benign

(1) innocuous joke, (2) innocuous substance

The spider in the corner of the room seemed **innocuous**, but it made her uneasy.

imperceptible

adj. undetectable or indiscernible by the senses or by normal means of measurement; extremely subtle, faint, or gradual

synonym: hard to notice, indiscernible, subtle

converge

cuff
