#### pandemic

 an outbreak of a disease that affects many people over a very wide area *synonym*: outbreak

(1) flu pandemic, (2) global pandemic

They fear a **pandemic** of a new type of virus.

#### afterward

adv. after the time mentionedsynonym: later, thereafter, following

(1) a few years **afterward**, (2) go there **afterward** 

We will explain the countermeasure concerning this problem afterward.

#### grieve

v. to feel or show great sadness or sorrow, especially for someone who has died

synonym: mourn, lament, sorrow

(1) **grieve** for loss, (2) **grieve** at the sad news

She **grieved** the loss of her parents.

#### coexist

 $\nu$ . to live or exist together at the same time in the same place

synonym: cohabit, accompany, synchronize

(1) coexist with nature, (2) coexist with diversity

The different species can **coexist** in the same ecosystem by filling different niches and using different resources.

#### postpone

- v. to delay or reschedule something to a later time or date synonym: delay, defer, reschedule
- (1) postpone meeting, (2) postpone event

Due to inclement weather, the game has been **postponed** until next week.

### mourning

n. the act or expression of sorrow or grief for someone who has died; a period of time set aside for such grievingsynonym: grieving, sorrow, lamentation

(1) mourning period, (2) mourning ritual

She wore black clothing as a symbol of **mourning** for her grandmother.

#### creditor

n. a person, company, etc. to whom a debtor owes money
(1) the creditor's claims, (2) bankrupt creditor
I asked the lawyer to initiate creditor negotiations for voluntary liquidation.

### euphemism

 a mild or indirect word or expression used in place of one considered to be too harsh or blunt when referring to something unpleasant or embarrassing

synonym: mild expression, implication, circumlocution

(1) genteel **euphemism**, (2) a **euphemism** for death The company used the **euphemism** "downsizing" to describe the layoffs of hundreds of employees.

coworker

 a person who works with another in the same company or organization

synonym: colleague, peer, associate

(1) **coworker** relationship, (2) argue with a **coworker** My ex- **coworker** and I had different working styles but managed to get along.
