confuse

# employ

to give somebody a job and pay them for it; to make use of

synonym: hire, engage, use

#### wealth

a large amount of money, property, or other things that someone or an organization owns

synonym: affluence, assets, fortunate

(1) majority of his wealth, (2) material wealth The **wealth** inequality was unavoidable.

#### single-handed

adj. done or accomplished by one person alonesynonym: alone, unassisted, solo

### wage
