medicinal

adj. of or relating to the treatment or cure of disease synonym: curative, therapeutic, healing

(1) **medicinal** chemistry, (2) traditional **medicinal**The **medicinal** properties of this herb have been known to help with various ailments.

intertwine

- v. to twist together or become twisted together synonym: interweave, interlace, entwine
- (1) **intertwine** thread, (2) **intertwine** story

 The vines **intertwine** to form a thick canopy overhead.

impure

adj. mixed with other substances or foreign matter; (of persons or behaviors) immoral or obscene, especially in sexual matters

synonym: contaminated, polluted, unclean

(1) **impure** water, (2) **impure** thoughts In some religions, pork is deemed **impure**.

imbalance

n. a situation in which two or more things are not equal or equally treated

synonym: inequality, asymmetry, instability

(1) trade **imbalance**, (2) symptoms of hormonal **imbalance** An **imbalance** in certain substances causes problems with brain function.

bloodletting

 the act of intentionally cutting a person's skin or vein to remove blood once thought to cure various illnesses; indiscriminate slaughter

synonym: bleeding, phlebotomy, blood donation

(1) bloodletting device, (2) ethnic bloodletting

The doctor used leeches for **bloodletting**, as they were thought to be more effective than cutting the skin.

purge

v. to remove or get rid of something, especially that is unwanted or impure

synonym: cleanse, clear, eliminate

(1) **purge** the system, (2) **purge** his sins

The government tried to **purge** corrupt officials from the bureaucracy.

industrious

adj. hardworking, diligent, and persistent in effort synonym: diligent, hardworking, assiduous

(1) industrious worker, (2) industrious student

He was known to be very **industrious** and would often work late into the night.

abdomen

n. the part of the body between the chest and pelvis that contains the stomach, intestines, liver, pancreas, and other organs; the posterior part of an insect's body, typically divided into segments

synonym: belly, gut, tummy

The weightlifter used his strong **abdomen** muscles to lift the heavy barbell.

clot

 a thick mass or lump of coagulated liquid, especially blood; a group of people or things that form an obstructive, unsympathetic, or resistant force

synonym: clump, coagulation, thrombus

The **clot** in the blood vessel required immediate medical attention.

bile

 a digestive fluid produced by the liver and stored in the gallbladder, which helps to break down fats in the small intestine; bitterness or spitefulness synonym: gall, bitterness, acrimony

The doctor identified excess **bile** in the patient's bloodstream, indicating a possible liver or gallbladder issue.

poisonous

 adj. containing or producing toxic substances; harmful or dangerous to living beings, often causing illness, injury, or death; capable of causing serious harm or destruction

synonym: toxic, venomous, deadly

(1) **poisonous** plants, (2) **poisonous** chemicals

Some species of **poisonous snakes** can be deadly to humans if bitten.

acetaldehyde

- a colorless liquid organic compound that is present in some fruits and vegetables and is also produced naturally in the human body as a byproduct of the breakdown of alcohol
- (1) **acetaldehyde** levels, (2) **acetaldehyde** toxicity Excessive consumption of alcohol can lead to a buildup of **acetaldehyde** in the body.

acetate

 a synthetic material made from cellulose acetate that is used to make various consumer products such as clothing, upholstery, and packaging materials

synonym: ethanoate

(1) acetate film, (2) acetate buttons

The shirt is made of a soft acetate fabric.

disseminate

v. to spread or distribute widely, especially information or ideas; to scatter or disperse

synonym: spread, circulate, propagate

doe

synonym: rabbit, bunny, hare

starvation

synonym: hunger, malnutrition, emaciation

The drought led to widespread **starvation** in the region.

electrolyte

- a substance that conducts electricity when dissolved in water or another solvent and that is essential for many physiological processes in the body
- (1) the strong **electrolyte**, (2) replenish his **electrolytes Electrolyte** imbalances can cause health problems.

disrupt

v. to prevent or stop something, especially an event, activity, or process, from continuing in the usual way by causing a problem or disturbance

synonym: interrupt, disturb, break into

(1) **disrupt** a well-ordered condition, (2) **disrupt** sleep I'm so sorry to **disrupt** you when you're pretty busy.

cirrhosis

n. a condition of chronic liver damage that leads to the formation of scar tissue causing loss of function and potentially liver failure; usually caused by excessive alcohol consumption or certain viral infections

synonym: liver disease, hepatic inflammation

(1) biliary **cirrhosis**, (2) alcohol-related **cirrhosis**Heavy alcohol use can lead to **cirrhosis** of the liver.
