synonym: coincidence, simultaneity, concurrence

(1) synchronicity theory, (2) synchronicity effect

The occurrence of events in **synchronicity** is often taken as a sign of divine intervention.

dopamine

- a chemical substance produced by nerve cells as a neurotransmitter; as a drug, it is used to treat shock and hypotension

The drug controls the level of **dopamine** in the brain.

sag

 to droop or hang down, especially due to a lack of support or the weight of something

synonym: droop, slump, bend

The old mattress **sagged** in the middle, making it uncomfortable to sleep on.

cartilage

 a tough, elastic connective tissue that is found in various parts of the body, such as the joints, the outer ear, and the tip of the nose

synonym: connective tissue, gristle, fibrocartilage

(1) cartilage damage, (2) nasal cartilage

The knee joint is supported by **cartilage**, which helps absorb shock and prevent bone damage.

pancreas

n. a glandular organ in the digestive system that produces several important hormones, including insulin and glucagon, as well as digestive enzymes that help break down food in the small intestine

synonym: gland, organ, islet

(1) pancreas inflammation, (2) pancreas function

The endocrine function of the **pancreas** involves the secretion of hormones such as insulin.

tedious

adj. tiresome or boring because of being repetitive, dull, or too long; causing mental or physical fatigue due to its unrelenting nature

synonym: boring, monotonous, dull

(1) tedious task, (2) tedious routine

The work of data entry can be **tedious**, but it is important for maintaining accurate records.

immunosuppressant

- a drug that lowers or stops the body's normal immune response
- (1) **immunosuppressant** therapy, (2) receive an **immunosuppressant**

We use **immunosuppressants** as an almost last resort for patients with this disease.

cofounder

- one of several people who establishes an organization or starts a business
- cofounder of the university, (2) late cofounder
 He is the cofounder and chairman of this tech company.

opportune

synonym: suitable, timely, practical

(1) **opportune** occasion, (2) an **opportune** remark The phone rang at the most **opportune** time.

medicinal

- adj. of or relating to the treatment or cure of disease synonym: curative, therapeutic, healing
