guise

 the outward appearance or aspect of someone or something, especially in a way that is different from usual or concealing the true nature

synonym: appearance, pretense, masquerade

(1) in the **guise** of a woman, (2) under the **guise** of friendship

They operated an illegal business under the **guise** of an employment agency.

opportune

adj. suitable or happening at a time that is suitable or convenient for a particular purpose

synonym: suitable, timely, practical

(1) **opportune** occasion, (2) an **opportune** remark The phone rang at the most **opportune** time.

authenticate

 to confirm or verify the validity or authenticity of something; to prove or establish that something is genuine or true

synonym: confirm, validate, verify

(1) authenticate documents, (2) authenticate software

license

The security system requires users to **authenticate** their identity before gaining access.

stalkerware

n. software or applications designed to monitor or spy on someone's activities without their knowledge or consent, often used for malicious purposes such as stalking or surveillance without authorization

synonym: spouseware, surveillanceware

tempting
