### indigenous

adj. someone or something that is native to or occurring naturally in a particular place

synonym: domestic, endemic, primitive

### heritage

 the culture and traditions that are passed down from previous generations

synonym: legacy, tradition, inheritance

(1) heritage site, (2) historical heritage

The **heritage** of the city is reflected in its architecture.

#### ancestor

a person from whom one is descended; a forefathersynonym: forebear, forefather, progenitor

(1) **ancestor** language, (2) earliest human **ancestor**My remote **ancestor** immigrated to the United States from Ireland in the 1800s.

#### communal

adj. belonging to or used by a group rather than individuals;for common use

synonym: collaborative, combined, collective

(1) **communal** swimming pool, (2) **communal** combination

of funds

**Communal** elections were held in several European countries.

### linguist

- a person who speaks several foreign languages; a person who studies or teaches languages or linguistics synonym: grammatist, philologue, polyglot
- (1) foreign linguist, (2) cognitive linguist Though I love literature, I'm a bad linguist.

#### **function**

the purpose or use of an object, system, or process; a n. particular activity or operation that is designed to serve a specific purpose; a mathematical concept that describes a relationship between two sets of values, called the input and output sets; (verb) to operate or work in a specific way, or to perform a particular task or purpose

synonym: purpose, mapping, job

(1) function properly, (2) immune function The brain is an incredibly complex organ that controls the body's function.

### phonetics

- the study of speech sounds and their physical properties; the study of the sounds of language and how they are produced, transmitted, and interpreted synonym: speech sounds, sounds of language
- (1) **phonetics** transcription, (2) **phonetics** theory The study of **phonetics** is essential for understanding the nuances of language.

### phonology

the study of the sound patterns of a language, including the distribution and organization of speech sounds; the study of the structure and systematic organization of speech sounds in languages

synonym: phonemics, sound patterns, sound structures

(1) phonology rules, (2) phonology of English The study of **phonology** concerns the systematic organization of sounds in a language.

### morphology

n. the study of the form and structure of plants, animals, and other organisms; the study of the alteration of word forms as they change from one part of speech to another

synonym: structure, form, anatomy

(1) **morphology** of a language, (2) cellular **morphology** The **morphology** of rocks can reveal clues about their geological history.

#### structure

 the way of construction of something and the arrangement of its parts, or a complex thing constructed of many parts

synonym: construction, architecture, establishment

(1) the **structure** of a machine, (2) **structure** and function of the brain

The organizational **structure** of start-ups is often flat and straightforward.

### syntax

- n. the grammatical order or rule of words in a sentencesynonym: grammar
- (1) French **syntax**, (2) **syntax** error Let's investigate the **syntax** of Latin.

### phrase

n. a group of words that mean something specific when used together

synonym: expression, idiom, term

(1) ready-made **phrases**, (2) noun **phrase** We bought a Spanish **phrase** book.

#### brain

 the organ inside the head that is responsible for one's movement, thought, memory, and feeling

*synonym*: intellect, mind, encephalon

basic brain function, (2) permanent brain damage
 rays revealed a small tumor in his brain.

#### communicate

 to share or exchange information with others by speaking, writing, moving your body, or using other

### signals

synonym: convey, share, transmit

- (1) **communicate** his anxieties to the psychiatrist,
- (2) **communicate** well with my advisor

Dolphins use sound to **communicate** with each other.

### polysynthetic

adj. referring to a language that makes use of many morphemes, often combining them to form words or phrases that convey complex ideas

synonym: complex, synthetic, compound

(1) **polysynthetic** language, (2) complex **polysynthetic** system

The Inuit language is known for its **polysynthetic** words, which can contain whole sentences within one word.

### compose

v. to write music, poetry, or formal writing; to constitute or make up a whole, or a specified part of it

*synonym*: compile, constitute, build

(1) **compose** an essay, (2) **compose** my thoughts The structure is **composed** of three main components.

### morpheme

 n. the smallest unit of a language that carries meaning; a combination of phonemes (= the basic units of sound in a language) that conveys a specific semantic or grammatical function

synonym: unit, phoneme, root

(1) morpheme analysis, (2) lexical morpheme

The teacher used the concept of **morpheme** mapping to help students improve their spelling and vocabulary skills.

slide

v. to move or cause to move smoothly along a surface without interruption

synonym: glide, drift, drop

(1) **slide** a card across the table, (2) **slide** a glance If necessary, you can **slide** the front seats forward.

#### murmur

v. to say something very quietly; to complain about somebody or something under one's breath

synonym: burble, gurgle, mutter

(1) **murmur** at low wages, (2) **murmur** a greeting He always **murmurs** at the ill-treatment.

### categorize

v. to put people or things into groups according to their features, types, etc.

synonym: classify, pigeonhole, sort

(1) **categorize** the image, (2) **categorize** the cause of failure

The biologist **categorized** the viruses into four groups.

### vary

v. to become different in terms of size, shape, etc.

synonym: alter, contrast, differ

(1) **vary** according to the age, (2) **vary** directly with the price Maximum heart rates **vary** a lot for each individual.

#### universal

adj. existing or affecting everywhere or everyone synonym: common, broad, worldwide

(1) **universal** life, (2) principles of **universal** design The picture earned near- **universal** acclaim from critics.

#### animate

- v. to make something full of interest and energy synonym: invigorate, energize, enliven
- (1) **animate** the body, (2) **animate** his soul The positive attitude of the supervisor **animated** the discussion.

### inanimate

adj. not having life or spirit; not animatesynonym: lifeless, inert, passive

(1) **inanimate** nature, (2) **inanimate** matter

The **inanimate** object was not capable of movement or feeling.

### span

 the entire length of something, such as time or space from beginning to end; the amount of space that something covers

synonym: interval, period, length

(1) the **span** of a bird's wings, (2) the average life **span** He slightly modified the **span** of training because it was just before a match.

#### masculine

adj. having characteristics or an appearance that are usually regarded as typical or appropriate for men

synonym: male, mannish, manly

(1) wear **masculine** attire, (2) **masculine** beauty

Her allure lies in her **masculine** rather than feminine beauty.

### feminine

adj. relating to women; having the features or appearance often associated with women

synonym: womanly, womanlike, femalelike

(1) add a feminine touch, (2) the sacred feminine
The dress mixes sophisticated lines with an appealing floral design for a classically feminine style.

pulse

n. the regular heartbeat as it sends blood around the body, especially when it is felt at the wrist or side of the neck; a solid regular vibration of sound, electric current, light, or other waves

synonym: beat, vibration, throb

(1) a weak **pulse**, (2) **pulse** waves

The cardiac monitor displays the intensity of your pulse.

### grammar

 the set of structural constraints on speakers' or writers' composition of clauses, phrases, and words

synonym: syntax, elements

(1) grammar checker, (2) Latin grammar

Mastering **grammar** takes a lot of time for those learning a foreign language.

#### relate

v. to establish a connection or association between two or more things; to narrate or tell about an event, experience, or relationship; to empathize or feel sympathy with someone or something

synonym: connect, link, associate

(1) **relate** a story, (2) **relate** a message

He tried to **relate** his experience to the group, but they couldn't understand.

### posse

 a group of people who come together for a common purpose, often to pursue or capture a criminal; a group of people who share a common interest, belief, or trait

synonym: crew, gang, retinue

(1) posse member, (2) posse of citizensMy friends and I formed a posse to search for the lost hiker.

#### environment

 the natural world such as air, water, and land in which humans, animals, and plants live

synonym: atmosphere, surroundings, climate

environment affairs, (2) chaotic environment
 Every human is responsible for taking care of the Earth's environment.

#### immemorial

adj. extending back beyond memory or record; very old synonym: ancient, age-old, time-honored

(1) **immemorial** relationship, (2) from **immemorial** times The ancient ruins had been there since **immemorial**, and their origin was mysterious.

### develop

to grow or expand; to improve or refine through a process of progress and refinement, often to achieve greater sophistication or complexity; to elaborate or add detail to something that is in the process of being created

*synonym*: evolve, progress, advance

(1) develop a strategy, (2) develop a skillWe must develop a new system to streamline our workflow

and increase efficiency.

### priceless

adj. extremely valuable or important

synonym: invaluable, incalculable, precious

(1) priceless work of art, (2) priceless opportunity

Investigators discovered **priceless** documents throughout the

house.

#### vast

adj. enormous in size, number, amount, or quantity

synonym: expansive, extended, boundless

(1) vast majority, (2) vast desert

A **vast** audience viewed the broadcast.

### endangered

adj. at risk of extinction because it is facing significant threats

*synonym*: at risk, threatened, vulnerable

(1) **endangered** species, (2) **endangered** ecosystem The government has implemented policies to protect the habitat of **endangered** animals.

#### vulnerable

adj. capable of being hurt or influenced physically or mentally

synonym: susceptible, exposed, weak

(1) a **vulnerable** bridge, (2) **vulnerable** parts of the body Infants and pregnant women are particularly **vulnerable**.

### policy

n. a set of rules, guidelines, principles, or procedures that govern decision-making or action, often used in the context of business or government; a course of action or plan of action adopted or followed by an organization or individual to achieve a goal or objective

synonym: strategy, plan, guideline

(1) health policy, (2) foreign policy

The company's new **policy** on remote work has made it a more inclusive workplace.

### govern

v. to legally control and direct a country, city, group of people, etc. and be responsible for introducing new laws, organizing and maintaining public services

synonym: control, rule, preside

(1) a nation's right to **govern**, (2) **govern** a public enterprise The regulations **governing** medical malpractice claims are rigorous.

### attempt

 an act or effort of trying to do something, especially something difficult

synonym: endeavor, effort, try

(1) the **attempt** to rescue the hostages, (2) a reckless **attempt** 

The third attempt was far more successful.

#### eliminate

- v. to remove or get rid of someone or somethingsynonym: wipe out, destroy, eradicate
- (1) **eliminate** contestants, (2) **eliminate** sexual barriers We can **eliminate** this possibility from those consumptions.

#### architect

- n. a person whose job is to design plans to be used in making something, such as buildingssynonym: creator, designer, planner
- (1) landscape **architect**, (2) **architect** of the peace accord The building **architect** tried to build the house above the tree.

#### residential

adj. relating to, suitable for, or used for living in synonym: domestic, homely, dwelling

(1) a **residential** district, (2) **residential** property

The city's **residential** area is known for its quiet streets and beautiful homes.

### mandatory

*adj.* required by a rule or law, compulsory *synonym*: compulsory, obligatory, required

a mandatory clause, (2) mandatory training
 Attendance at the meeting is mandatory for all employees.

#### attendance

- n. the act of being present at an event or gathering; the number of people present at an event or gatheringsynonym: presence, participation, appearance
- (1) attendance sheet, (2) low attendance
  Attendance at the meeting is mandatory for all employees.

#### rid

v. to make someone or something free of unwanted or unpleasant tasks, objects, or person

synonym: do away with, free, clear

(1) get **rid** of the rats, (2) **rid** the body of waste products We must **rid** ourselves of pollution.

#### absorb

- v. to take in a fluid or other substance gradually synonym: consume, soak, ingest
- (1) **absorb** energy, (2) **absorb** a shock The sponge **absorbs** water well.

### politic

adj. wise and displaying the ability to make reasonable decisions

synonym: wise, tactful, expedient

a politic decision, (2) heal the body politic
 she was politic in her behavior.

### atrocity

- n. brutal act; an extremely wicked or cruel actsynonym: evil, horror, iniquity
- (1) commit **atrocity**, (2) cold-blooded **atrocity**The **atrocity** of the war left many children orphaned.

### tuberculosis

- an infectious disease usually caused by tubercle bacteria that can attack many parts of a person's body, especially their lungs
- (1) died of **tuberculosis**, (2) a medicine for **tuberculosis Tuberculosis** used to be considered a fatal disease.

### epidemic

 the widespread outbreak of a particular disease in a large number of people at the same time

synonym: outbreak, contagion, plague

a worldwide epidemic,
 health epidemic
 the disease is now reaching epidemic proportions in our country.

#### defund

v. to withdraw or cut off funding or financial support from a person, organization, or project

synonym: divest, disinvest, withdraw funding

(1) **defund** the healthcare system, (2) **defund** an organization

The protest movement has called on the government to **defund** the police department.

### government

 n. the group of people with authority to control a country or state

synonym: administration, regime, state

(1) **government** bureaucracy, (2) **government** funding The federal **government** is planning to increase taxes for the next fiscal year.

#### retirement

- n. the fact or act of stopping working and leaving one's job synonym: resignation, withdrawal, retreat
- (1) **retirement** from politics, (2) impending **retirement**This fund is responsible for disability and **retirement** benefits.

#### church

 a building or institution dedicated to religious worship or activities; a Christian religious organization or denomination

synonym: chapel, cathedral, synagogue

(1) church bell, (2) small church

The **church** on the corner is hosting a free community meal tonight.

#### suffer

v. to experience pain, distress, or hardship; to undergo or endure something painful or unpleasant

synonym: endure, undergo, tolerate

(1) suffer a setback, (2) suffer bad grades

The older man **suffers** from arthritis and finds it difficult to move around.

#### emotional

adj. relating to people's feelingssynonym: affecting, impactful, impressive

(1) emotional health, (2) emotional distress

Human **emotional** responses vary widely depending on the society to which they belong.

#### abuse

- n. the use of something in an incorrect or harmful mannersynonym: misuse, misconduct, vilification
- (1) the problem of drug **abuse**, (2) victim of sexual **abuse** Our company has an audit team that monitors directors for **abuse** of authority.

#### attend

- v. to be present at an event, to go to a place synonym: go, be present, accompany
- (1) **attend** a meeting, (2) **attend** service We must **attend** to this matter.

#### institutionalize

v. to establish or make something a part of an institution (= a place such as a university, hospital, etc.)

synonym: formalize, establish, regularize

(1) **institutionalize** a system, (2) **institutionalize** customary laws

The new policy aims to **institutionalize** the use of renewable energy sources.

#### settlement

an official agreement that brings an argument to a close;
 the process of establishing permanent residence in a place.

synonym: agreement, accommodation, colonization

(1) the **settlement** of a dispute, (2) **settlement** in a new house

Our goal must be to achieve a peaceful **settlement**.

#### lawsuit

 a legal action taken by one party against another in a court of law, typically seeking damages or some other form of remedy for perceived wrongs or harms suffered

synonym: suit, legal action, litigation

(1) lawsuit settlement, (2) file a lawsuit

The company is facing a **lawsuit** for its alleged discrimination against employees.

#### reconciliation

 the restoration of cordial or friendly relations; getting two things to correspond

synonym: accord, agreement, settlement

(1) national **reconciliation**, (2) **reconciliation** of financial accounts

They had a complete **reconciliation** a few days after their argument.

#### commission

 a formal instruction, command, or request given to a person or group; an official group of people entrusted by a government or other official body to control or enforce something

synonym: task, duty, authority

(1) **commission** appointed by the government, (2) the **commission** of murder

She gets a **commission** on each contract.

#### survivor

a person who remains alive after an event in which others have died

synonym: subsister

(1) ovarian cancer **survivor**, (2) a single **survivor**The shipwreck **survivor** was rescued after floating in the ocean for three days.

### explore

v. to travel to or penetrate an area or a country to learn about it; to thoroughly examine a subject or a possibility to learn more about it

synonym: analyze, delve into, examine

(1) **explore** the world, (2) **explore** our options

The management must **explore** strategies to increase office security.

#### constitute

v. to be the essential or fundamental elements or parts of something; to establish, appoint, or assign someone to a particular office or position; to make up or compose something

synonym: comprise, form, make up

(1) **constitute** a threat, (2) **constitute** a majority

The new regulations **constitute** a significant change in the industry standards.

### genocide

- n. the intentional killing of a large group of people,especially those of a particular ethnic group or nationsynonym: mass murder, extermination, annihilation
- (1) **genocide** victims, (2) **genocide** resolution

  The international community condemned the **genocide** in the country.

#### mass

 a large amount of a substance with no definite shape or form; a large number of people or things grouped or crowded together

synonym: abundance, crowd, mob

(1) a **mass** of molten rock, (2) critical **mass**The **mass** of people who do not own property is politically impotent.

### biology

- the scientific study of life and the natural processes of living things
- (1) evolutionary **biology**, (2) cell and molecular **biology** In junior high school, we had to dissect a frog in **biology** class.

#### destruction

- n. the act of causing so much damage to somethingsynonym: devastation, annihilation, ruin
- (1) path of **destruction**, (2) cyclonic **destruction**

The extinction of several subspecies has been linked to climate change and habitat **destruction**.

### reproductive

adj. connected with the process of reproduction; relating to reproducing babies, young animals, or plants

synonym: procreative, generative

(1) **reproductive** ability, (2) during **reproductive** period This documentary deals with the **reproductive** biology of the buffalo.

### cemetery

 a burial ground or graveyard; a place where dead bodies are buried

synonym: graveyard, burial ground, memorial park

(1) **cemetery** plot, (2) historic **cemetery** 

We visited the **cemetery** to pay our respects to our deceased loved ones.

#### beacon

 a light or other visible object serving as a signal, guide, or warning

*synonym*: lighthouse, guidepost, marker

(1) an aerial **beacon**, (2) **beacon** of hope

The lighthouse served as a **beacon** to guide ships safely into port.

### pertain

v. to be relevant or applicable to a particular subject or situation; to belong to or be connected with something

synonym: relate, concern, apply

(1) **pertain** to the case, (2) **pertain** to the topic

The new regulations **pertain** to all employees, regardless of their position.

### adequate

adj. enough, acceptable, satisfactory for a particular purpose or need

synonym: enough, acceptable, able

(1) **adequate** parking facilities, (2) provide **adequate** funding

This argument is still not adequate.

### acknowledge

v. to accept or admit the existence, reality, or truth of something; to accept that someone or something has a particular authority or quality; to express obligation, thanks, or gratitude for someone's help, commitment, etc.;

synonym: accept, agree, declare

(1) **acknowledge** the deed, (2) **acknowledge** his help He never **acknowledged** his fault.

### aboriginal

 adj. relating to the people, culture, or history of the original inhabitants of a particular region, especially before the arrival of colonizers or settlers; indigenous

synonym: native, indigenous, autochthonous

(1) aboriginal art, (2) aboriginal land

Many **aboriginal** cultures have deep spiritual connections to the land and its natural resources.

#### aim

- v. to try or plan to get or achieve something synonym: aspire, direct, target
- (1) **aim** at a specific target, (2) **aim** to be a nurse We **aim** for an overseas expansion.

### preserve

v. to keep or maintain a particular quality, feature, etc., especially to prevent it from decaying, being damaged, or being destroyed

*synonym*: conserve, care for, maintain

(1) **preserve** my strength, (2) **preserve** a country's heritage They worked hard to **preserve** the nature of their native lands.

#### attach

- v. to fasten, join, or connect one thing to another synonym: fix, fasten, bind
- (1) **attach** firmly, (2) **attach** a file to an e-mail He does not **attach** importance to these rumors.

#### commissioner

 an official member of a government department or another organization who is responsible for controlling something or performing specific duties

synonym: administrator, agent, official

(1) elect police **commissioners**, (2) **commissioner** of patent office

He became an audit **commissioner** because of his years of experience as an accountant.

### secondary

adj. of a lower rank, status, or importance about something else; not primary or central; derived from or caused by another source

*synonym*: subordinate, ancillary, lesser

(1) **secondary** education, (2) **secondary** sources The **secondary** camera on my phone takes high-quality photos.

#### reclaim

v. to take back something previously lost, given, or paid, or ask to have it back

synonym: recoup, regain, retake

(1) **reclaim** a competitive position, (2) **reclaim** land from the sea

You may be entitled to **reclaim** some tax.

#### colonize

v. to establish a colony in or on a specific place; to settle or occupy in large numbers

synonym: settle, occupy, inhabit

(1) **colonize** planets, (2) **colonize** for cultivation European powers **colonized** much of the Americas in the

16th and 17th centuries.

#### nation

 a large organized community of people living in a particular country or region and having a particular culture

synonym: country, state, sovereign entity

(1) nation-state, (2) a seafaring nation

The nation of Japan is known for its unique culture and

### advanced technology.

### adopt

v. to choose to follow something; to legally take a child from another family and care for them as if they were one's own

synonym: accept, assume, take on

(1) adopt a child, (2) adopt a bill

The national assembly has adopted the budget.

### declaration

- n. a formal or explicit statement or announcementsynonym: statement, announcement, proclamation
- (1) **declaration** of independence, (2) unilateral **declaration** The President made the **declaration** of war.

### appropriate

adj. suitable or proper in the circumstances; fitting synonym: fitting, suitable, proper

(1) **appropriate** behavior, (2) an **appropriate** time It would be **appropriate** to dress nicely for the wedding.

#### statistics

- the discipline that concerns the collection, organization, analysis, interpretation, and presentation of data
- (1) **statistics** for cancer, (2) official **statistics**The **statistics** demonstrate that poverty and unemployment are genuine problems.

dire

adj. extremely serious or urgent; critical, grave, or disastrous synonym: serious, critical, desperate

(1) suffer **dire** poverty, (2) **dire** situation

The **dire** economic straits called for immediate action.

atlas

- n. a book of maps or charts; a figure in Greek mythology who bore the weight of the world on his shoulderssynonym: map, chart, gazetteer
- (1) atlas map, (2) atlas of anatomy

The world atlas showed me the locations of all the countries.

### undergo

v. to go through something unpleasant or that involves a change

synonym: experience, suffer, endure

(1) **undergo** surgery, (2) **undergo** a decrease The train has to **undergo** rigorous safety checks.

#### revitalization

- n. the process of giving new life or energy to somethingsynonym: renewal, reactivation, rejuvenation
- (1) **revitalization** project, (2) **revitalization** of humanity The **revitalization** of the downtown area brought new life to the community.

### adoption

- n. the action or fact of legally taking another's child as one's own; the act of accepting with approval
- synonym: fostering, acceptance, custody
- (1) **adoption** assistance, (2) the **adoption** of a plan
  The **adoption** process can be long and difficult, but it is worth it for the love of a child.

#### immersion

 the act of putting someone or something into a liquid completely; the state of being completely involved in a subject or activity

synonym: submergence, involvement, engagement

(1) baptism by **immersion**, (2) **immersion** in acid
I felt like I was in a different world because of the **immersion** experience of virtual reality.

### kindergarten

 a school or class for young children, usually between the ages of four and six

synonym: preschool, nursery school, daycare

(1) **kindergarten** class, (2) **kindergarten** teacher The **kindergarten** students were having a good time playing with toys.

### grade

n. a particular level of quality, size, importance, etc.

synonym: score, rate, degree

(1) boys in the twelfth **grade**, (2) students at all **grade** levels Departments may set requirements for a higher **grade** point average.

#### intermediate

adj. situated between two locations, things, states, etc.; around the middle of a scale of evaluation

synonym: middle, medium, central

(1) intermediate sanction, (2) intermediate level

Purple is **intermediate** between blue and red.

#### fluent

adj. able to communicate in a specific language smoothly or effectively, or easily

synonym: eloquent, articulate, smooth-spoken

(1) fluent Chinese, (2) in a fluent tone

She learned five languages but is only **fluent** in two of them.

### esteem

 great respect and approval for or a good opinion of someone

synonym: respect, admiration, regard

- (1) **esteem** for the other person, (2) boost my self- **esteem** He is our loyal customer who should be held in high **esteem**.
- a structure in which animals lay their eggs or give birth to their young

synonym: roost, perch, burrow

(1) bird's **nest**, (2) a **nest** of thieves

The female birds build a **nest** and lay their eggs in May.

### kiln

nest

 an oven or furnace used for baking, drying, or firing clay, pottery, bricks, or other materials; typically made of brick or refractory material and heated with wood, coal, or gas

synonym: oven, furnace, hearth

(1) brick kiln, (2) electric kiln

The pottery was fired in the **kiln** for several hours to harden it.

### multigenerational

adj. involving or encompassing multiple generations,
 particularly within a family or community; relating to or
 affecting people of different age groups or life stages

synonym: cross-generational, intergenerational

(1) multigenerational home, (2) multigenerational workforce

The **multigenerational** family farm has been passed down for generations.

### tradition

 a belief, custom, or way of doing something that has been passed down from generation to generation within a group or society

synonym: custom, practice, ritual

(1) a **tradition** of a culture, (2) against **tradition**It is a **tradition** in many families to have a big Thanksgiving dinner with all their relatives.

### possibility

- n. a chance that something may happen or be truesynonym: chance, prospect, likelihood
- (1) **possibility** for growth, (2) **possibility** of a major earthquake


