sterile

siphon

shopkeeper

neoclassical

supple

Newtonian

 The motion of planets can be described using **Newtonian** mechanics.

rev

determinant

- *synonym*: cause, factor, element

One **determinant** of success is having a positive attitude and a strong work ethic.

steer

 synonym: guide, direct, control
- (1) **steer** a steady course, (2) **steer** a conversation The captain told him to **steer** the ship north.

remunerate

- v. to pay someone for their work or services; to compensate or reward for work done

babysitter

tempt
